

MINUTES COUNCIL MEETING
REYNOLDSBURG CITY COUNCIL
November 10, 2014

President of Council Doug Joseph called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

Members of Council present: Mel Clemens, Barth R. Cotner, Chris Long, Dan Skinner, Leslie Kelly and Scott Barrett, Cornelius McGrady III.

Reports: Susan Lewis Kaylor, Chief Administrative Officer, ADAMH Board of Franklin County

Good evening. My name is Susan Lewis Kaylor and I work at the ADAMH Board of Franklin County. Thanks for giving me a few minutes. I am not here asking for anything tonight but rather just giving you an update. I brought brand new directories for any of your constituents that may need services and we also brought you our most recent annual report. Mostly I just want to give you an update and check in to make sure all of your residents in Reynoldsburg know how to access the ADAMH system of care. If they need alcohol, drug or mental health treatment services. To give you a little update on some of the prevention work we are doing in your community as well. Just an overview of about who we are. ADAMH is part of local Franklin County government. We are governed by an 18 member independent board of trustees. Half of which are appointed by the county commissioners and half by the combined state department. Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Treatment services. We contract with 35 nonprofit agencies throughout the community to deliver care in mental health, drug and alcohol treatment and then prevention services. By statute we cannot do any direct service whatsoever so we work with a network of care. Our job as the county board is to plan, fund and evaluate for services in this community. We just got done with our most current needs assessment which is now on our website. It is talking about the existing and potential unmet needs for the next 7-10 years in our system and in our community. We are funded by state, federal and local funds but 75% of our funding is from the local property tax levy. Last year we invested about \$76 million dollars in treatment and support services to Franklin County residents. As I said 75% of that is from the local levy. With the \$76 million we served 23K people with some sort of treatment or support services in Franklin County. That includes housing, vocational services in addition to treatment support services. We served an additional 75K youth and adults through prevention services. Last year here in Reynoldsburg more than 525 people received services and we invested \$1.1 million just to give you an idea. I am sure you recognize a lot of our contract agencies from Mary Haven which is our oldest alcohol and drug treatment programs to Concord Counseling, Southeast Mental Health and then Netcare are the crisis front door system. One of the most exciting things that we have been working on the last couple of years is working with suburban school districts and we have really been working each community based on what they are asking us to help as the mental health board. Here in Reynoldsburg we have a brand new investment as well. We are continuing to work with the Superintendent on what the services should look like but they are going to be mostly in Reynoldsburg High School. We are excited about that. We are in more than 140 suburban school buildings in Franklin County. As you know from recent news coverage that there is a heroin epidemic and painkiller epidemic is throughout every community. No community is immune from that so we are doing a lot on the alcohol and drug addiction prevention side as well mental health care. We are also working on anti-stigma to make sure that residents know where they can get treatment in our system of care. We do cover uninsured individuals. Our 35 contract agencies provide Medicaid funded services and many of which also take private pay on a sliding fee scale depending on the individual's ability to pay. That is just the overview. I would be happy to answer any questions and we are here to provide any additional materials that you may need for your constituents.

I am an educator and I work with a number of these entities and I have seen firsthand the difference that they can make for the lives of students and families. Thank you for what you do.

Mr. McGrady: Do you have a direct point of contact for the Comp Drug Youth to Youth that I may contact?

Ms. Kaylor: We sure do. Comp Drug is listed in there and Youth to Youth is under there. Dustin Mets is the CEO of that organization. They do a lot of great work throughout the community with middle school and high school kids.
