Community Comments and Requests

Parker Gutman, 6969 Tanya Terrace: Hello. Hoping everyone's had a great day so far. For those of you who don't know me, my name is Parker Gutman. I'm a sophomore who goes to the Bell Academy and Livingston Campus. On behalf of student council I'm hear to speak briefly on our homecoming parade that's coming up on October 4th. Student council today is making a change we need for our community and our schools and the small things like homecoming parade per se. Mark McKenzie, 1014 Lancaster Ave: Thank you President Joseph, members of council. First I'd like to commend you for so quickly moving to bring your rules of council into correspondence with the charter involving the waiver of the three reading rule and in light with that I would also like to talk a little bit more about some things in the charter that may have drifted off a bit. Just to remind you, you guys swear an oath to uphold the charter the City of Reynoldsburg, but if you don't know the contents of the charter it seems like this might be a little hard to do and also to remember that the charters are master document. It can't be superseded by code or council rules. Three council meetings ago you passed ordinance 8117 with just 5 votes. There were only 5 people here that night and that was a zoning ordinance change that had not been forwarded to you from the Planning Commission with a recommendation for adoption. I questioned the action and it was explained to me as acceptable because this ordinance was not an application as defined by city code and I'd just like to point out that by section 411 zoning measures of the city charter, section C, a conferring vote of at least 3/4 of the membership of council shall be necessary to pass any zoning ordinance or resolution, which differs from the written recommendation of the Planning Commission. So while there may be a code that would differentiate between applications to the zoning commission and also zoning ordinance or zoning changes it is in the charter that both of those require a 3/4 vote. So, if there's only 5 members here that falls short of the 6 needed. It's no big deal, but it's just kind of strange saying that when I asked about it, it was said that by code it didn't apply. Secondly, the city is currently seeking outside entity to prepare a comprehensive plan. The criteria has been developed by which they will choose such an entity. The Planning Commission has been pretty much bypassed in this endeavor. We were not informed this was going on. We are not solicited for our input and Article 7 Boards and Commissions Section 701 Planning Commission C, the Planning Commission shall conduct studies and surveys and prepare advisory plans, reports, and maps relatively overall planning of the growth of the city. The Commission shall be responsible for the preparation implementation of the comprehensive plan for the city and subsequent plan amendments for council approval. So, it's easy to see how these things can drift, but in those things in which I am somewhat familiar with from being a member of the Planning Commission it seems that we have stopped exactly the correspondence with the charter. Any questions?

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Mr. Sampson: The goal of the city right now is that we're advertising for professional qualifications from professional planning for it's intent on the steering committee for the comprehensive plan. Once we've selected the consultant planning will be an essential part of that. We will have members of the planning committee on that steering committee. Selecting the consultant is where we're at right now.

Mark McKenzie: It's just that since I've been appointed to Planning Commission I've been attempting to get the Planning Commission engaged in the comprehensive plan for the city and pretty much have been stonewalled, prevented from accomplishing very much, and then to hear that it was moving forward, that a selection process is going on and when questioned about it I was told that when you'd finalized it we would be informed of the matter that it just seemed like it wasn't going according to what the charter should stipulate and I just wanted to bring that forward for you if you are asked to approved anything regarding that stuff, keep in mind that that is given as a responsibility to the Planning Commission and really to no one else by the charter. Alright, thank you gentlemen.

Stacie Baker, 1101 Bergenia Dr: It's a question that popped in my head here looking at the agenda about buying the property at 7312 E Main Street. I was just asking what's the purpose of buying that property, if there's one right now?

Mr. Joseph: This is community comment. We don't necessarily answer questions during the community comment period unless council wants to ask a question or respond to it directly.

Stacie Baker: It's a nice piece of land. I was just wondering. Maybe there's a big picture or something.

Mr. Joseph: I'll just open it up to the council. Does the council have any questions for Mr. Baker?

Reports

Central Ohio Greenways Board presentation- Kerstin Carr MORPC

Mr. Joseph: Next we have Item 9A. We have a report, Central Ohio Greenways Board presentation - Kerstin Carr MORPC.

Kerstin Carr: Good evening council members. Thank you so much for allowing me to briefly update you on the efforts that are going on with the Central Ohio Greenways Board. I realize you have a lot of decisions to make today and it's a packed agenda. I'll try to be short. There's a presentation on your screens, but basically my name is Kerstin Carr. I'm with the Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission. I'm the Director of Planning and Environment there. About two years ago we created the Central Ohio Greenways Board. It's a 22 member board. Very diverse representation of non-profit local government and private sectors with the goal to build more trails in central Ohio, get more people on these trails. The emphasis behind this board was really the fact that central Ohio is expected to grow by upwards to a million people by the year 2050. I know I see several of you here that's been part of the Inside 2050 Academy and our inside 2050 study a few years ago not only found out that central Ohio is expected to grow significantly, but also that the demographic make-up is going to be different. We will experience a doubling of our baby boomer population and also the millennials are now being the largest generation coming up. Those cohorts really want or need different lifestyles in terms of smaller housing option, being a more walkable, bikeable, and transit friendly neighborhoods. There's a great demand for an active transportation system. An infrastructure, namely walking and biking infrastructure. People want to feel connected. They want to be active. They also want to feel safe doing so. Trails are a great amenity and really serve as the backbone for this active transportation network. A few years ago we conducted an impact of trail study for central Ohio and that really showed that our trails are heavily used and that people love our trails and they want more of them. We put counters on our over a hundred miles of regional trails and found out that our trails were traveled 12 million miles annually. We also talked to a lot of our businesses and they thought trails are (?) for attracting talent to the community. When the Central Ohio Greenways Board was created it was created with a vision of we want to have a

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world class network of trails that is easily accessible to every central Ohioan and we want to achieve this again by building more trails and getting more people out on those trails. The first thing we did is we hired planning next, a consultant, to help us conduct a 5 year strategic plan. One thing they did was a best practices report. They basically went out and looked at seven regions across the country to better understand why they are having successful trail systems in terms of how they are getting funding, how are they marketing these trails, how are they building these trails. It was really helpful in shaping the 5 year strategic plan and the 53 action items that came out of it. For example, they used Texas and they were able to get a 50 million dollar endowment from a foundation there to build their parks and trail system. Philadelphia was able to get 10 million dollar foundational grant to build out their trail system. A lot of ways for our board to look at in terms of how can we be more successful in accessing private and foundational dollars to help support the local government funds that we all know are pretty scarce and really help build out that trail system and connect everyone to it. As part of the strategic plan we had 53 action items developed and within the first 2 years our board was very successful and already completing a few. The first one is we have a 7 county focus area and I'll show that in another slide. For each county by the end of the year we will have mapped out where the existing trails are and where we want trails in the future to really have that vision to go out and try to get more funding. We worked hard on marketing materials from creating brochures, doing videos, but also updating our website. So, centralohiogreenways.com now has an interactive map. You can actually map your route. You get more information about all the trails that are out there. We also work with the Columbus Foundation to create an endowment fund so people can donate money to it. We work with the Central Ohio Hospital Association and so all four major hospital systems are currently piloting at one primary care site and one of them is here in Reynoldsburg. I want to say it's Ohio Health, but it could be Mount Carmel. I can follow up with you on this. And to basically prescribe trail usage for patients with a certain rate of BMI's. They are doing this for the year. Trying to see if people are responding and actually doing. Walking more. Being more physically active and if they are also getting healthier as a response of that. If that's successful then that would be rolled out for the entire region. Also, next one we updated our regional trail signage. The Blacklick Trail is one of our regional trails here. You see the, you probably recognize the (?). It has pretty nice trail signage already, but we are now, as we are getting more connected, especially with some of the State Trails, like the Ohio to Erie Trail, we want to make sure that the way finding is easier. That it's more unique and ambiguous signage style that people that are using the trails can easily orient themselves and identify with. The next slide shows that 7 county focus area. Obviously with Franklin County in the middle. Those are all counties that either are active in trail development or have trail plans going on or where made sure state by trail the Ohio to Erie Trail, that's the great trail that's going from Madison County to the left all the way up north to Knox County is in. That obviously can expand over time. This is not the final map. This is the map that we had originally to go with and as I said we now have been going out to all these counties and so hopefully within a few months we have an updated map that really shows where those trail connections will be and how we will connect, for example, the TJ Evans Trail in Licking County over to the Blacklick Trail in down to Reynoldsburg essentially. This is the Reynoldsburg trail area right now. You see the Blacklick Trail in blue going south towards Pickerington, Groveport, and then all the way up to the Alum Creek Trail. It's really amazing from Reynoldsburg right now without interruption you can be on

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a trail and ride all the way to the City of Westerville, which I have done. Obviously one of the things that we'd like to see from communities is continue to connect the Blacklick Trail up north, but also to make sure that you have city by connections to the trails, so that I don't have to put my bike in the car and drive to the trail head and then ride my bike, but that I can actually ride my bike from home. So, I'm working with Bill and Dan and your wonderful staff here and your wonderful Mayor looking at Waggoner Road and some other connections where you're still missing some of those multi-use paths will be a huge amenity and a great accessibility to the trail system. Those are just some of the, a little bit more detailed view of the proposed connectivity and your current trail way system there. It doesn't show all of the bike facilities that you already have in place. With that I promise I keep it short. I'll open it up for any questions you might have.

Mr. Cicak: Why does this path come down behind Rosehill School instead of coming down Lancaster Ave? It seems that its routed right through a bunch of private property.

Kerstin Carr: The proposed one?

Mr. Cicak: Yes, you see where the park is with the green and the loop and it comes down. It doesn't go to the right and follow Lancaster Ave down. Instead of having a sidewalk, it could be a multi-use path. Here, where they have it routed it would have to go through probably a hundred backyards.

Kerstin Carr: Yes, that's really good feedback. We have received; we didn't put that information up ourselves. We received that through some community input. Know that this is not, the red routes just show a general idea of where the connectivity would be, but once you get into the planning of it that can change at any time. So, that's valuable input. I'll bring that back and to look at it.
