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Community Comments

Roslyn DeVaux-Spitzley

7634 Ridgemont Court

Ms. DeVaux-Spitzley wanted to advise Council about her landlord, who was belligerent toward her when she asked for repairs, and to report a rat and mouse infestation in and around her apartment in The Ridge. She stated that the rodents were coming from a brush pile on the property behind her building. She had tried to contact the property owner, who was out-of-state with no luck. She felt the rodent infestation was community wide. She called the fire marshal, who came out and inspected. She was awaiting his report. She had contacted the landlord, but he did not feel there was an issue. She also commented that she felt there was lead in her water as it was brownish. She had spoken with the City's Water Superintendent. She requested that Council be proactive and address this issue.

Councilmember Bryant suggested she put her rent into escrow and contact Legal Aid. Ms. DeVaux-Spitzley indicated that Legal Aid did not handle that type of case.

On April 25th, you will be voting on approving funding for speed humps for the Quarry Park development. I have a previously scheduled appointment and will not be able to attend the council meeting, but I would like to make you aware of some information that I think you should be familiar with before the vote.

I serve on Reynoldsburg's Traffic & Transportation commission, as well as having more than 30 years of experience in the transportation engineering field. Let me caveat this letter by saying that the views expressed here are solely my own, and do not necessarily reflect those of EMH&T, your City engineering consultant and my employer. Since the location of the speed humps do not impact me personally, I have "no dog in the fight," as they say. However, I would like for the City to avoid unnecessary and frivolous spending when the funds can be put to better use.

Traffic studies were performed within the Quarry Park development over a period of 6 weeks. I have attached this data for your review. The results show that the average speed of vehicles during the test period was 26-27 mph. Priestley Drive is posted at 25 mph, so that is quite reasonable. There would only have been 1%-3% of enforceable violations. The street is not a "race track," as some people will say. The speeding problem is perceived. The request for speed humps is based on a strawman argument, as it is intended to fix a problem that does not exist.

Getting right to the point, according to the petition signed by some residents, there is only a 48% buy-in, meaning that slightly more than half of the residents are opposed to the addition of speed humps. The number of proposed humps have already been reduced from the original plan after some residents reevaluated their positions after being informed that the humps would be located near their own homes. The reason that this is important is that eventually - based on past experiences - most residents are likely to request that the humps be removed. The arguments for or against the effectiveness of speed humps do not matter. The simple fact is that **they were previously installed in five locations within the City, and then removed later at the request of the residents.** One such location was on Kingsley Drive - just one street over from the proposed location of the humps. That sets a fairly clear precedent.

Approving funding for this project will ultimately not be limited to the \$36,000 being requested at this time. History demonstrates that the City is, in effect committing itself to the

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future cost of removing the humps and repairing the pavement at some point in the future. Feel free to contact me if you have any questions or require further information.

Chris Marby - His comment was via email and read into the record
956 Quarry Park Drive

As I stated, the street is not very long so there is a lot of unnecessary acceleration and speeding, it's a chronic problem. I and my neighbors have contacted police on numerous occasions. I even joined the local HOA board to see if I could get this problem resolved.

Since the pandemic started, I have been working from home and have had a front row seat to the speeding on my street. So far, I have had many panic attacks as I watched children playing in the street, just barely being missed by a speeder who slams on their breaks just to make the turn onto Sandrock. Just last month I watched a Reynoldsburg City School bus speed going at least 35-40 miles an hour, to go where? Marble Park?

I know that on at least on two occasions a speed monitor has been placed on Priestley Drive in an effort to slow traffic speed. This has been somewhat effective, but the results have been temporary. When the speed monitor is removed, high acceleration and speeding resumes. A monitor has not been placed on Quarry Park Drive that I know of.

I worked with other HOA board members to petition the City Council to consider installing speed bumps or speed tables. On the streets that I canvassed, we had overwhelming support and received more than 50% of signatures for homes on those streets, except for Marble Park. I canvassed all streets but Priestly and Windrift. This was the easiest sell I have ever had to do. I would walk up to the home, explain what we are doing and as soon as I said "speed bump" they are like "where do I sign."

Nobody wants their child to be the first one hurt or killed in this neighborhood.

I, like many here, fear it is just a matter of time before there is a tragic accident. During the time we have lived in our home, I have watched many cars speed past the Priestly and Quarry Park intersection, I watched a motorcycle wreck and slide as it tried to turn from Sandrock onto Quarry Park Drive and I have watched a toy ball roll out into the street while a 6 year old child chased it, just as a car was passing the house.

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I know some would like to say that speed bumps lower house values, look ugly, or are a pain for emergency vehicles. But what is worse, a fire truck that takes 20 seconds longer to respond or an unnecessary accident where someone loses a loved one?

It is my hope that the City Council will APPROVE speed bumps for the Quarry Park neighborhood as the residents have stated they want and need.

Mayor Begeny

Mayor Begeny advised Council that Attorney Shoo was unable to attend the meeting due to an emergency and Director Dorman was attending a funeral. He provided an update on the East Main Street Project. The project started in 2019 with an application by the previous Council and Administration for an OPWC grant. The City worked with the property owners and engineers to design a plan for the improvements. The construction officially began in 2021, but was delayed four months due to issues with Columbia Gas and their gas line improvements. AEP has completed the underground installation of the electric lines and are waiting for AEP to remove the electric poles. The repairs to the curbs and sidewalks around Memorial Plaza are being completed. As soon as that work is complete, the Lancaster Road intersection should be open. Work has now begun on improvements to the south side of East Main on the retaining wall. That work will continue between Vick's and Jackson Street for the next month or so. The City has also tried to work with the property owners on the north side of the street to improve the parking area behind those businesses that are connected to the City's lot. However, a couple of businesses were not interested in participating in the project. The City will make improvement to our lot, but the remaining areas are private property and the responsibility of those owners to maintain and repair. The Planning Commission approved the development for the former Happy Dragon site at the corner of East Main Street and Lancaster Avenue. The City will work to improve and expand the parking between that site and Prost to add approximately thirty-nine additional parking places. The City meets every week and a half with the contractor to discuss issues including traffic issues. One of the biggest traffic delay issues is cars turning west onto East Main Street from Jackson Street. The City has tried adjusting traffic light timing to ease traffic flow, but that was only effective during spring break. Moving barrels when contractors are not at work has also been discussed. The City and contractor will work to determine if that is feasible. However, worker safety is paramount and maintaining slower traffic speeds so workers can work without worrying about being hit. As soon as work in the intersection is complete, the remaining sidewalk work should move along quickly. Council will be reviewing legislation for Phase II of the project from Jackson Street to Waggoner Road. The City has reached out to Columbia Gas to make sure they understand the schedule for this

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section. The Jackson to Waggoner section has fewer obstacles and should move along at a faster pace. Regarding the local businesses, the City has been in touch with the businesses from early on in the project through today. During the pandemic, the City provided \$240,000 to our small business owner including some in this area on East Main Street. We continue to meet with them and will be working with Tempo Taco for the Cinco de Mayo celebration. The Mayor also provided information about the progress regarding the utility aggregation process due to the bankruptcy of Volunteer Energy. Staff is in the process of reviewing proposals and should have a presentation for Council by the second meeting in May. Director Dorman will be recommending a one-year contract. Residents can review their own options on the PUCO Apples to Apples website. The Mayor thanked Councilmembers and staff for helping with the Community Clean-up Day this past Saturday. He counted over 385 cars. He should have results of the collection in the next several weeks.

Development, Parks & Recreation Committee

This is the Development, Parks & Recreation Committee meeting for April 25, 2022.

Members in attendance are: Councilmember Cotner, Councilmember Lawson-Rowe, Councilmember Pyakurel, Chair Baker and President Jenkins.

An Ordinance Appropriating Funds from the Unappropriated General Fund to Various Accounts in the Parks and Recreation Department

Director Bauman explained that this legislation will transfer multiple sponsorships and field rental payments that were deposited into the General Fund and transfer those monies into various recreation fund accounts.

Councilmember Baker moved to forward this Ordinance to Council for a first read. Second by Councilmember Lawson Rowe. Motion carried.

Public Safety, Law & Courts Committee

This is the Public Safety, Laws and Court Committee meeting for April 25, 2022.

Members in attendance are: Councilmember Cotner, Councilmember Pyakurel, Councilmember Lawson Rowe, Chair Bryant and President Jenkins.

An Ordinance to Repeal and Replace Chapter 511 Fireworks of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Reynoldsburg

Mayor Begeny advised that Attorney Shook had amended the legislation to reflect Council's comments from the previous meeting and Chair Bryant's comments. The changes reflect that fireworks would be permitted in the City on July 3rd, 4th, and 5th from 8:30pm until 10:30pm and on New Year's Day from midnight until 1:00am.

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Councilmember Baker questioned whether the July times began at 7:30pm to 8:30pm. Mayor Begeny would confirm with Attorney Shook.

Councilmember Pyakurel expressed his appreciation for the legislation and its limited nature. It was at least providing some type of control. He would not be objectionable to removing the New Year's Eve time as it was very late.

Councilmember Bryant was in favor of the limited authorization of fireworks and was not whetted to permitting fireworks on New Year's Eve.

Councilmember Lawson Rowe questioned the burden on the police department in being able to enforce these restrictions.

Deputy Chief Grizzell advised that she was not aware of Chief Baker's discussion during the previous meeting. However, the Chief was in favor of limiting the time frame and would defer to Council's decision. The department would need to actually see the fireworks being fired in order to cite someone, but the department would act in accordance with Council's decision.

Councilmember Bryant restated Attorney Shook and Chief Baker's positions from the previous meeting that the noise ordinance would be more enforceable than any firework violation. The noise ordinance was a different standard of probable cause for law enforcement. The current language allows for some firework displays, but restricts the more lenient multiple month displays. Most residents are law-abiding and will comply with the law.

Mayor Begeny advised he would share Council's comments with Attorney Shook.

Councilmember Bryant moved to forward the Ordinance to Council for a first read. Second by Councilmember Pyakurel. Motion carried.

This is the Public Service & Transportation Committee meeting for April 25, 2022.

Members in attendance are: Councilmember Cotner, Councilmember Lawson-Rowe, Councilmember Pyakurel, Chair Strickland and President Jenkins.

An Ordinance Authorizing the Mayor to Enter into a Contract with Strawser Paving Company for Construction Services Pertaining to Installing Speed Tables on Priestly Drive, Appropriating Funds, and Declaring an Emergency

Mayor Begeny explained the process the City went through to get to this legislation. The City spoke with a number of residents up and down Priestley Drive from Waggoner Road to Quarry Park Drive regarding speeding. Residents have sent in letters and petitions. Speeding concerns on Priestley as well as other areas of the City were discussed by the Transportation Committee. Officers and speed trailers were dispatched to the area where things would improve for a while and then return. Issues were also looked at regarding a stop sign violations at Windrift Place. An illuminated stop sign was installed at that location. Letters were sent to residents on July 29, 2020 and February 22, 2021 inviting residents to a town hall meeting to discuss this issue. Information collected from residents have indicated a fairly even fifty-fifty split between residents who would like to see speed tables installed and those who would not. This issue has been an ongoing issue for many years predating this administration. Throughout the many meetings and discussions, there are three options that have been presented:

1. round the clock enforcement, which is not a viable option;
2. closing down Dickens Drive between Priestley and Kingsley, which was recently connected (not practical);
3. some type of speed deterrent.

The City has had speed bumps on Kingsley years ago and even at the Livingston school campus that all were eventually removed. What is being suggested this evening is nine speed tables to be located on Priestley Drive, Quarry Park Drive, Sandroek Avenue, Slate Park Avenue, and Marble Park Avenue? The City contacted residents where these speed tables were being located to let them know and solicit

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their response. Two residents, who lived across the street from each other, requested that the speed table be removed from that location. These speed tables will slow traffic, but be less disruptive to vehicles when traveling over them. The City has spoken with the fire department and our streets department regarding this installation. They do not anticipate any problems due to the speed tables. The City would like to try speed tables in this location to determine the effectiveness and possibly look at other installations in the City including Brice Road north of East Main Street.

Councilmember Strickland followed up on a comment made earlier by a resident about Kingsley having had speed bumps and those being removed. Do we know how long ago that was?

Mayor Begeny estimated that those speed bumps were removed around 2002 or 2003.

Councilmember Pyakurel shared an incident where a car sped around another car seemingly going the speed while he and Councilmember Baker were standing on the sidewalk. Speeding certainly can be an issue. He asked the difference between a speed hump/bump and a speed table and if there was anything else that could be done.

Mayor Begeny stated that outside of 24-hour enforcement, speed tables were the easiest options. Corners and sidewalks areas can be pushed out into the street more, but that is an expense and may not be effective. A speed tables are wider and lower, while speed humps/bumps are narrow and higher. The City does not have the capacity to deal with most of the speeding issues. It comes down to personal responsibility of drivers making sure they do not accelerate through neighborhoods. Officers can do spot enforcement for a while to regulate behavior, but once the police officers leave, the behavior resumes. Installing speed tables may reduce traffic and speed on Priestley, but it may just divert traffic to other streets. Installing these speed tables has been presented as a separate ordinance to allow Council to see the cost of such installation and to allow residents to speak on this issue. Should Council approve this Ordinance, all impacted residents will be contacted by the City and advised when the roadway road and speed table installation would occur.

Councilmember Baker stated that he travels Priestley fairly frequently and sees vehicles exceeding the speed. He felt Priestley was one of the highest ranking places in the City for speed tables. I was initially for raising the cost of a speeding ticket.

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Councilmember Cotner asked if the City had traffic data for all of the sites where the speed tables were being installed. He understood there was data for Priestley Drive, but was there data for Quarry Park or Marble Park? He felt it was reasonable to try to do something on Priestley, but questioned whether the speed tables were necessary on the other areas.

Mayor Begeny indicated that he would get all of the speed studies available and share with Council.

RE: The GFOA established the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting Program (COA) in 1945 to encourage and assist state and local governments to go beyond the minimum requirements of generally accepted accounting principles to prepare annual comprehensive financial reports that evidence the spirit of transparency and full disclosure and then to recognize individual governments that succeed in achieving that goal. Each annual comprehensive financial report is reviewed using a checklist designed to determine compliance with both generally accepted accounting principles (**GAAP**) and program policy as established by the GFOA's Special Review Executive Committee and the GFOA Executive Board.

Reviews are performed by GFOA staff and members of the GFOA's Special Review Committee, which comprises individuals from government, the public accounting profession who possess specialized expertise in governmental financial reporting, typically as a result of either preparing or auditing an annual comprehensive financial report that has received the Certificate of Achievement.

Reviewers are never selected from the same state as the report being reviewed or from the same firm that performed the independent audit.

The Special Review Executive Committee (SREC) is an eleven-member group established by the GFOA's Executive Board and charged with overseeing the operations of the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting Program. The SREC also is responsible for establishing program policy, subject to review by the Executive Board.

Several communities in Ohio have adopted similar legislation. The language prepared and presented is similar in structure and style to those other communities. The draft has been incorporated into Chapter 503, Unlawful Discriminatory Practices.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 503 UNLAWFUL DISCRIMINATORY
OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF REYNOLDSBURG TO
DESIGNATE CONVERSION THERAPY AS A DISCRIMINATORY ACT OR
PRACTICE**

WHEREAS, the City of Reynoldsburg recognizes that efforts which seek to change an individual's sexual orientation or gender identity are harmful to young people; and

WHEREAS, such efforts to change an individual's sexual orientation or gender identity pose critical health risks including, but not limited to, confusion, depression, social withdrawal, suicidal ideation, substance abuse, self-hatred, and feelings of being dehumanized; and

WHEREAS, the American Academy of Pediatrics, the American Medical Association Council on Scientific Affairs, the National Association of Social Workers, and the American Counseling Association Governing Council each have asserted in reports or position statements that sexual orientation change efforts, including conversion therapy, are not recommended and may be harmful; and

WHEREAS, while the State of Ohio does not currently prohibit such harmful conversion therapy, several municipalities in Ohio have adopted such prohibitions, including the cities of Lakewood, Athens, Kent, Dayton, Columbus, Akron, Toledo, and Cincinnati.

WHEREAS, the City of Reynoldsburg has a compelling interest in protecting the physical and psychological well-being of minors and protecting minors against exposure to serious harms caused by conversion therapy; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Reynoldsburg desires to prohibit the use of conversion therapy with minors by enacting an amendment to Chapter 503 Unlawful Discriminatory Practices.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REYNOLDSBURG, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 503 Unlawful Discriminatory Practices of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Reynoldsburg be and the same is hereby amended to add Section 503.10, "Conversion Therapy Prohibited" as associated definitions to read as follows:

SEE ATTACHED EXHIBIT A.

SECTION 2. That upon adoption by Council, this Ordinance shall be in effect thirty days following signature by the Mayor.

503.03 Definitions

As used in this Chapter:

- A. “Age” means at least forty (40) years old.
- B. “Aggrieved individual” means an individual who claims to have been injured by an unlawful discrimination act or practice described in this Chapter.
- C. “City Attorney” means the individual duly elected pursuant to Section 6.01 of the Charter of the City of Reynoldsburg.
- D. “Complainant” means an aggrieved individual who, pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter, files with the Clerk of Council a written complaint alleging an unlawful discriminatory act or practice.
- E. “Disability” means a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one (1) or more major life activities, including the functions of caring for one’s self, performing manual tasks, walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, breathing, learning, and working; a record of a physical or mental impairment; or being regarded as having a physical or mental impairment.
 - 1. “Physical or mental impairment” includes any of the following:
 - a. Any physiological disorder or condition, cosmetic disfigurement, or anatomical loss affecting one (1) or more of the following body systems: neurological; musculoskeletal; special sense organs; respiratory, including speech organs; cardiovascular; reproductive; digestive; genitor-urinary; hemic and lymphatic; skin; and endocrine;
 - b. Any mental or psychological disorder, including, but not limited to, orthopedic, visual, speech, and hearing impairments, cerebral palsy, autism, epilepsy, muscular dystrophy, multiple sclerosis, cancer, heart disease, diabetes, sickle cell, human immunodeficiency virus infection, intellectual disabilities, and emotional illness.
 - 2. “Physical or mental impairment” does not include any of the following:
 - a. Pedophilia, exhibitionism, voyeurism, or other sexual behavior disorders;
 - b. Compulsive gambling, kleptomania, or pyromania;
 - c. Mental or psychological disorder, or disease or condition, caused by an illegal use of any controlled substance by an employee, applicant, or another individual, if an employer, employment agency, personnel placement service, labor organization, or joint labor management committee acts on the basis of that illegal use.

- F. “Discriminate”, “Discrimination”, or “Discriminatory” means to differentiate and treat differently including to segregate or separate.
- G. “Employee” means an individual employed by an employer but does not include any individual employed in the domestic service of any person.
- H. “Employer” means any person who regularly employs for compensation four (4) or more individuals, excluding the employer’s parents, spouse, and children, including any person acting directly or indirectly in the interest of an employer, provided “employer” does not include a public school system, or an agency of government other than the City.
- I. “Employment agency” means any persons regularly undertaking with or without compensation, to procure opportunities for employment or to procure, recruit, refer, or place employees.
- J. “Familial status” means either of the following:
 - 1. One (1) or more individuals who are under eighteen (18) years of age and who are domiciled with a parent or guardian having legal custody of the individual or domiciled, with the written permission of the parent or guardian having legal custody, with a designee of the parent or guardian; or
 - 2. Any person who is pregnant or in the process of securing legal custody of any individual who is under eighteen (18) years of age.
- K. “Gender Expression or Identity” means actual or perceived gender-related identity, expression, appearance, or mannerisms, or other gender-related characteristics of an individual, regardless of the individual’s designated sex at birth.
- L. “Hearing Officer” means a neutral independent contractor, hired by the City, who conducts an administrative hearing based on a complaint filed pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter.
- M. “Housing accommodations” including any buildings or structure or portion thereof which is used or occupied or is intended, arranged, or designed to be used or occupied as a home residence or sleeping place of one (1) or more individuals, groups or families, whether or not living independently of each other; and any vacant land offered for sale or lease. It also includes any housing accommodations held or offered for sale or rent by a real estate broker, salesman, or agent, or by any other person pursuant to the authorization of the owner, by the owner, or by such person’s legal representative.
- N. “Labor organization” includes any organization that exists, in whole or in part, for the purpose of collective bargaining or of dealing with employers concerning grievances, terms or conditions of employment, or other mutual aid or protection in relation to employment.

- O. “Military status” means a person’s status in “Service in the uniformed services” as defined in Section 5923.05 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- P. “Natural hair types and natural styles commonly associated with race” means hairstyle, type, and texture, treated and untreated, as well as protective hairstyles such as natural hair, afros, braids, twists, cornrows, and locks, which hair types and hairstyles are commonly associated with African-Americans and their racial ethnic, and cultural identities.
- Q. “Person” includes one (1) or more individuals, partnerships, associations, organizations, corporations, legal representatives, trustees, and trustees in bankruptcy, receivers, and other organized groups of persons. It also includes, but is not limited to, any owner, lessor, assignor, builder, manager, broker, salesman, agent, employee, lending institution; and the City of Reynoldsburg and all political subdivisions, authorities, agencies, boards, and commissions thereof.
- R. “Place of public accommodation” means any inn, restaurant, eating house, barbershop, hotel, motel, bank or other financial services institution, public conveyance by air, land or water, theater, store, or other place for the sale of merchandise, or any other place of public accommodation or amusement where the accommodation advantages, facilities, or privileges thereof are available to the public.
- S. “Protected Class” means a classification of individuals based on one or more of the following characteristics: race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, familial status, disability, pregnancy, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, or natural hair types and natural styles commonly associated with race.
- T. “Public use areas” means interior or exterior rooms or spaces of a privately owned building that are made available to the general public.
- U. “Restrictive covenant” means any specification in a deed, land contract or lease limiting the use of any housing because of race, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, age, disability, marital status, familial status, genetic information, or military status or any limitation based upon affiliation with or approval by any person, directly or indirectly, employing race, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, age, disability, marital status, familial status, genetic information, or military status as a condition of affiliation or approval.

- V. "Service in the uniformed services" means the performance of duty, on a voluntary or involuntary basis, in a uniformed service, under competent authority, and includes active duty, active duty for training, initial active duty for training, inactive duty for training, full-time national guard duty, and performance of duty or training by a member of the Ohio organized militia pursuant to Chapter 5923 of the Ohio Revised Code. "Service in the uniformed services" includes also the period of time for which a person is absent from a position of public or private employment for the purpose of an examination to determine the fitness of the person to perform any duty described in this division.
- W. "Sex" means male, female, neither, or both, and includes pregnancy, any illness arising out of and occurring during the course of a pregnancy, childbirth, or related medical conditions.
- X. "Sexual orientation" means a person's actual or perceived homosexuality, bisexuality; or heterosexuality.
- Y. "Source of Income" means lawful income, including but not limited to, income derived from wages, social security, supplemental security income, any form of federal, state or local assistance payments or subsidies, including rent vouchers, child support, spousal support, and public and private assistance which can be verified and substantiated.
- Z. "Uniformed services" means the Armed Forces, the Ohio organized militia when engaged in active duty for training, inactive duty training, or full-time national guard duty, the commissioned corps of the public health service, and any other category of persons designated by the president of the United States in time of war or emergency.

AA. "Unlawful discriminatory practice" means any act prohibited by Chapter 503 of the Reynoldsburg Code of Ordinances.

BB. "Conversion therapy" means any practices or treatments that seek to change an individual's sexual orientation or gender identity, including efforts to change behaviors or gender expressions or to eliminate or reduce sexual or romantic attractions or feelings toward individuals of the same gender. Conversion therapy shall not include counseling that provides assistance to a person undergoing gender transition, or counseling that provides acceptance, support and understanding of a person or facilitates a person's coping, social support, and identity exploration and development, including sexual-orientation-neutral intervention to prevent or address conduct or unsafe practices, as long as such counseling does not seek to change an individual's sexual orientation or gender identity.

CC. "Mental health professional" means an individual who is licensed, certified or registered under the laws of the State of Ohio to provide, to an individual or group, mental health services, including but not limited to, the assessment or improvement of mental

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emotional, psychiatric, psychological, or psychosocial adjustment or functioning, regardless of whether there is a diagnosable, pre-existing disorder or disease. Mental health professions include but are not limited to physicians specializing in the practice of psychiatry, psychologists marriage and family therapists, licensed clinical social workers, professions clinical counselors, behavioral clinicians or therapists, nurses or any other persons offering such mental health services.

AA.

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503.09 Conversion Therapy Prohibited

No mental health professional shall engage or cause another to engage in conversion therapy with a minor, without regard to whether the mental health professional is compensated or receives any form of remuneration for his or her services. A violation of this section shall be an unlawful discriminatory act or practice.

 - Maintain a record of the work performed to include correspondence and daily project representation reports.
- EMH&T will coordinate with the Owner and Contractor prior to conducting both the pre-final and final project walk-throughs for participation and input of documented deficiencies.
 - EMH&T will prepare punch list for work performed not in accordance with the contract documents.

- EMH&T will coordinate with the Contractor to address required warranty work.
 - Re-inspect punch list work until completed in accordance with the contract documents.

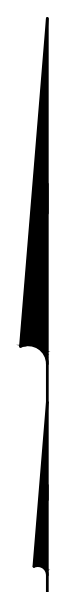

 - Updated submittal log and discuss outstanding submittals for review
 - Status of all change orders, change requests and requests for information
 - Status of all pay requests
 - Follow-up on outstanding items and issues along with new items and issues to be reviewed
 - Review drawings with updates provided by Contractor
 - Sign-in sheet
 - Meeting summary for the City, Engineer, and attendees
- Review initial and monthly schedule updates with respect to general project parameters and provide a copy of the schedules and EMH&T's comments to the Owner for review and comment.

WHEREAS, The Governor recently signed House Bill 172 into law amending Ohio Revised Code 3743.45 effective July 1, 2022, allowing any person authorized to possess consumer grade fireworks to discharge them on their own property or on another person's property with permission on the certain designated days, and further allowing local municipalities to restrict the dates and times that individuals may discharge consumer-grade fireworks or to impose a complete ban on the use of consumer-grade fireworks; and

SUMMARY

Effective November 4, 2021

- Extends a general moratorium on the issuance of new, and geographic transfer of existing, fireworks manufacturer or wholesaler licenses from December 31, 2021, to December 31, 2022.
- Establishes a one-time license application and issuance date, outside of the normal fireworks manufacturer and wholesaler licensing timeline, at the end of the new license moratorium.

Effective February 7, 2022

- Establishes the Ohio Fire Code Rule Recommendation Committee to review the Fireworks Law and make recommendations to the State Fire Marshal.
- Requires the State Fire Marshal to adopt rules regulating the time, manner, and location of consumer fireworks use.
- Imposes a 4% fee on the retail sale of consumer grade fireworks, beginning May 18, 2022.
- Credits revenue from the new fee to fund firefighter training programs and the State Fire Marshal's administration of the Fireworks Law.
- Creates a new license allowing retailers to sell ground-based or hand-held sparklers called "fountain devices."
- Requires the State Fire Marshal to enforce the new provisions for fountain device retailers and to adopt related rules.

- Increases from 5,000 to 7,500 square feet the maximum floor area of a retail sales showroom, to which the public has access, that a licensed fireworks manufacturer or wholesaler uses to sell consumer grade fireworks, but requires expanded showrooms to be equipped with sprinkler systems meeting a specific standard.
- Establishes that the “state militia” for purposes of an existing exemption from the Fireworks Law is the state militia as recognized by the Adjutant General of Ohio.

Effective July 1, 2022

- Allows individuals to possess consumer-grade fireworks in Ohio, eliminating a requirement that purchasers transport consumer-grade fireworks out of the state within 48 hours of purchase.
- Allows any person authorized to possess consumer grade fireworks to discharge them on their own property or on another person’s property with permission on the following days:
 - New Year’s Day;
 - Chinese New Year;
 - Cinco de Mayo;
 - Memorial Day weekend;
 - Juneteenth;
 - July 3, 4, and 5, and the Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays preceding and following;
 - Labor Day weekend;
 - Diwali;
 - New Year’s Eve.
- Permits local governments to restrict the dates and times that individuals may discharge consumer-grade fireworks or to impose a complete ban on the use of consumer-grade fireworks.
- Requires licensed retailers, manufacturers, and wholesalers selling consumer grade fireworks to the general public to offer safety glasses at the point of sale, for free or a nominal charge.
- Requires licensed retailers, manufacturers, and wholesalers selling consumer grade fireworks to the general public to also provide purchasers with a safety pamphlet that contains, at a minimum, specified information.
- Prohibits discharging fireworks (1) while in possession of, or under the influence of, alcohol or a controlled substance, or (2) on the property of another without the property owner’s permission.
- Allows the State Fire Marshal to suspend a fireworks manufacturer or wholesaler license if the licensee has violated the Fireworks Law or the State Fire Marshal’s rules.

- Prohibits the State Fire Marshal from unreasonably withholding a variance that would allow hobbyists to manufacture, possess, and use individual display-grade and consumer-grade fireworks and requires cause for revocation of a hobbyist variance.
- Requires hobbyists seeking variances to demonstrate that they can engage in the hobby safely and legally, and limits hobbyists to possession of five pounds of raw materials and finished fireworks produced through the hobby.

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DETAILED ANALYSIS

Effective November 4, 2021, due to emergency clause

The act includes an emergency clause for provisions extending a moratorium on the issuance of new fireworks manufacturer and wholesaler licenses and the geographic transfer of existing licenses. Due to the emergency clause, those provisions took effect November 4, 2021.¹

Geographic transfer moratorium

The act extends for one year the moratorium on the geographic transfer of fireworks manufacturer and wholesaler licenses, which was scheduled to expire on December 31, 2021. Under the act, this moratorium is set to expire on December 31, 2022.²

Fireworks license moratorium and one-time license period

The act also extends the general moratorium on the issuance of new fireworks manufacturer and wholesaler licenses for a particular plant or location. Under prior law, the moratorium applied to all persons except those who already possessed a license for that plant or location immediately prior to June 29, 2001, and would have expired on December 31, 2021. The act extends the moratorium until December 31, 2022, and allows renewal of licenses that were geographically transferred under exceptions to the transfer moratorium created by the 2021 Transportation Budget, [H.B. 74](#) of the 134th General Assembly.

To coincide with the planned end of the new-license moratorium, the act establishes a one-time license period for new fireworks manufacturers and wholesalers. Any person who does not hold a fireworks manufacturer license that will run through January 1, 2023, may submit an application for one by November 1, 2022. If the application meets the requirements for licensure, the State Fire Marshal must issue a license on January 1, 2023.

Licenses issued at the end of the moratorium will run through November 30, 2023. The issuance date and license period are a departure from continuing law's usual requirements, which only allow fireworks manufacturer and wholesaler licenses to be issued on the first day of December, with a one-year duration.

Under the act, after the moratorium expires, the State Fire Marshal may issue new fireworks manufacturer and wholesaler licenses, but those licenses must not be approved in a manner that unduly burdens the State Fire Marshal's ability to ensure public safety.³

Effective February 7, 2022

Several of the act's provisions take effect on February 7, 2022.⁴ Those provisions are discussed in this section.

Fire Code Rule Recommendation Committee

The act creates the Ohio Fire Code Rule Recommendation Committee to review the Fireworks Law and make recommendations to the State Fire Marshal. At a minimum, the Committee must make recommendations relating to:

- Fireworks wholesaler and manufacturer licensing and operations;
- Consumer-grade fireworks purchases;
- The moratorium on licenses described above;
- Building code requirements for 1.3G display-grade fireworks manufacturing facilities; and
- A licensing program for fireworks wholesalers and manufacturers.

The Committee must meet periodically, with a first meeting by February 17, 2022. It must submit its report and recommendations to the State Fire Marshal by May 18, 2022.

The Committee is to be made up of the following individuals:

1. The State Fire Marshal, or the State Fire Marshal's designee;
2. Four local fire chiefs appointed by the Ohio Fire Chiefs' Association, or appointed by the Association's designee;
3. A local police chief appointed by the Attorney General, or the Attorney General's designee;
4. Five members of the Ohio State Pyrotechnics Association, appointed by the president of the Association, one of whom must be a licensed wholesaler, one of whom must be a licensed exhibitor, and one of whom must be a licensed manufacturer;
5. One member of Prevent Blindness Ohio, or the organization's designee;
6. One member of the Ohio Optometric Association or the association's designee;
7. One member of the Ohio Pyrotechnic Arts Guild or the guild's designee;
8. One representative of the Ohio Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, appointed by the chapter president;
9. One member of the Ohio Council of Retail Merchants or the council's designee.⁵

Rules for consumer-grade fireworks use

The act requires the State Fire Marshal to adopt rules regulating the time, manner, and location of consumer grade fireworks use (see “**Consumer grade fireworks**,” below). The rules must permit adults to safely and responsibly use consumer grade fireworks on private property with the owner’s consent, and are not to be construed as a de facto ban on that use. The rules may, however, include provisions requiring that all fireworks be used in accordance with manufacturer’s instructions and provisions for the following:

- The use of aerial fireworks;
- Separation distances between fireworks discharges, ignitions, or explosions and adjacent structures, railroads, roadways, airports, publicly owned or controlled places, and places where hazardous materials are manufactured, used, or stored;
- Fireworks use on common areas of multi-tenant properties;
- The suspension of fireworks discharges, ignitions, or explosions during times of drought or similar conditions;
- The proximity of fireworks discharges, ignitions, or explosions to children; and
- Any other similar matters.

The State Fire Marshal must file those rules with the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review by August 8, 2022. If filed on that date, the earliest possible effective date for the rules would be October 23, 2022, though the State Fire Marshal may file the rules before August 8, 2022 (but not before February 7, 2022) for the rules to take effect earlier.⁶

Consumer-grade fireworks fee

To provide revenue for training programs and regulation of the fireworks industry, the act imposes a fee on licensed sellers of consumer-grade fireworks. The fee is 4% of each licensed retailer’s, manufacturer’s, and wholesaler’s gross receipts from the retail sale of consumer-grade fireworks beginning May 18, 2022. The act excludes sales tax the retailer, manufacturer, or wholesaler collects on behalf of the state or local governments from “gross receipts.”

Licensed retailers (see “**Fountain device retailer licenses**,” below), manufacturers, and wholesalers may separately or proportionally bill the fee to others, but must themselves report and remit it to the State Fire Marshal annually, no later than October 23.

The fee’s proceeds are to be credited to the Fireworks Fee Receipts Fund, which the act creates. The State Fire Marshal must use $\frac{7}{8}$ (87.5%) of the money in the fund for firefighter

training programs. The remaining $\frac{1}{8}$ must be used to pay the State Fire Marshal's expenses in administering the Fireworks Law.⁷

If the State Fire Marshal determines that a licensee has failed to timely report and remit the fee, the State Fire Marshal may either:

- Order the licensee to report and remit the fee within a specified timeframe; or
- Revoke or deny renewal of the license, which requires the licensee to immediately cease operations. It also prohibits licensed manufacturers and licensed wholesalers from applying for new licenses for two years.

The State Fire Marshal is also permitted to adopt rules necessary to administer and enforce the fee.⁸

Fountain device retailer licenses

The act creates a new license for retailers who wish to sell what are called fountain devices. Under the act, a “**fountain device**” is defined as a specific type of 1.4G consumer grade firework that is all of the following:

- Nonaerial and nonreport producing;
- Recognized and manufactured in accordance with sections 3.1.1 and 3.5 of APA standard 87-1 (2001 edition);
- A ground-based or hand-held sparkler with one or more tubes containing a nonexplosive pyrotechnic mixture that produces a shower of sparks, with or without additional effects that may include a colored flame, audible crackling effect, audible whistle effect, or smoke; and
- Containing no more than 75 grams of the pyrotechnic mixture in any individual tube and no more than 500 total grams of the mixture total in the case of multiple tubes.⁹

General licensing process

Generally, the act requires prospective fountain device retailers to apply to the State Fire Marshal by September 30 in any given year. An application must be submitted for each location at which the person wishes to sell fountain devices, and must include:

- A license fee, to be set by the State Fire Marshal at \$25 or less;
- An affidavit affirming that the applicant is in compliance with the National Fire Protection Association's standard “NFPA 1124, Code for the Manufacture, Transportation, Storage, and Retail Sales of Fireworks and Pyrotechnic Articles (2006

Edition)” (NFPA 1124) or that they will be in compliance before engaging in the storage and sale of fountain devices; and

- Proof of insurance in an amount and type specified in rules by the State Fire Marshal.

The act requires the State Fire Marshal to review timely submitted applications and determine if they comply with its requirements. If an application is compliant, the State Fire Marshal must issue a license. Licenses are effective for one year, beginning December 1. The State Fire Marshal must send licensees a written notice of expiration by September 1, annually, and licensees must apply for renewal by October 1 of the year the license expires.¹⁰

Special licensing circumstances

The act establishes two special licensing circumstances for fountain device retailers. The first is a one-time license that starts October 25, 2022. Any person wishing to be licensed as a retailer of fountain devices on that date must submit an application by August 16, 2022. If an application is received by the deadline, and if the State Fire Marshal determines that it meets the act’s licensing requirements, the State Fire Marshal must issue a license on October 25, 2022. Licenses issued that day will be effective through November 30, 2023.

The second special licensing circumstance for fountain device retailers applies to retailers that open for business after the annual application deadline in a given year. Those retailers may apply for a license any time between the date they open for business and the subsequent annual deadline. If an application is received under this provision between October 1 and November 30, and meets the act’s requirements for fountain device retailers, the State Fire Marshal must issue a license no earlier than December 1 and no later than two months after the application is received. If a compliant application is received at any other time pursuant to the provision, the State Fire Marshal must issue the license no later than two months after the application is received. These licenses are effective through the last day of the following November.¹¹

Licensed fountain device retailer operations

Licensed fountain device retailers are authorized to possess fountain devices and sell them at retail. Possession and storage of the devices, though, must comply with NFPA 1124 and several other requirements. Those are:

- Sales displays are limited to 300 square feet, total, with no display larger than 150 square feet, and all displays at least 25 feet from other highly flammable materials.
- Retailers may only possess and sell fountain devices as packaged merchandise with covered fuses.

- Fountain devices displayed for sale must be under visual supervision of an employee or other responsible party whenever the retailer is open to the public.
- The possession, storage, *and sale* of the devices must also comply with any rules adopted by the State Fire Marshal pursuant to the act (see “**Rules for fountain device retailers**,” below).
- Sales to minors are prohibited.
- Sales to individuals who are obviously drunk or under the influence of a drug of abuse are prohibited.
- All sales must be conducted from the licensed location and be made inside of a licensed building; sales from any structure or device outside of a licensed building, such as a tent or trailer, are prohibited.
- Retailers must prohibit smoking in the licensed location.
- Purchasers must be provided with the pamphlet and the opportunity to obtain safety glasses that the act requires for other consumer-grade fireworks sales. (See “**Safety glasses and pamphlets required**,” below).¹²

Rules for fountain device retailers

The act requires the State Fire Marshal to adopt rules for fountain device retailers under the Administrative Procedure Act. The rules must be designed to promote the safety and security of employees, the public, and the premises from which fountain devices are sold, be consistent with the Revised Code and NFPA 1124, and, at a minimum, address the following:

- With respect to buildings and other structures on a retailer’s premises:
 - Cleanliness and orderliness;
 - Heating, lighting, and use of stoves and flame-producing items;
 - The availability of fire extinguishers or other fire-fighting equipment and their use;
 - Emergency procedures.
- Storage of fountain devices; and
- Insurance.

The State Fire Marshal must file the rules with the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review by August 8, 2022. If filed on that date, the earliest possible effective date for the rules

will be October 23, 2022, though the State Fire Marshal may file the rules before August 8, 2022 (but not before February 7, 2022).¹³

Enforcement authority

The act grants the State Fire Marshal authority to inspect a fountain device retailer's premises, inventory, and retail sale records to ensure compliance with the Fireworks Law and the State Fire Marshal's rules. If an inspection reveals noncompliance, the State Fire Marshal has discretion to do one or more of the following:

- Order the retailer, in writing, to eliminate, correct, or otherwise remedy the issues by a certain date;
- Order the retailer, in writing, to immediately cease the storage and sale of fountain devices; and
- Revoke, or deny the renewal of a license pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act. If a license is revoked, the State Fire Marshal must remove the retailer's name from the list of licensed retailers and must notify local law enforcement of a revocation or refusal to renew.¹⁴

Showroom size

Under continuing law, a licensed manufacturer or wholesaler may sell consumer grade fireworks only from a representative sample showroom or a retail sales showroom. Under prior law, if a retail sales showroom was used (and first began to operate on or after June 30, 1997), the showroom structure to which the public had access for retail purposes was limited to 5,000 square feet. The act increases the limit to 7,500 square feet. The act also expands application of the size limit to fireworks showrooms that resume operations at any time after a one-year or greater period of inactive licensure status, even if they were in operation prior to June 30, 1997.

Showrooms that expand beyond 5,000 square feet, to which the public has access, pursuant to the act's increased limit, must be equipped with a sprinkler system meeting the standard for "extra hazard (group 2) occupancies" under "NFPA 13, Standard for the Installation of Sprinkler Systems (2019 Edition). Variances may be granted to the standard's requirement, however, if the State Fire Marshal finds that a proposed sprinkler system matches or exceeds the degree of safety provided by a compliant system.¹⁵

Militia exemption

Under continuing law, the U.S. military and the militia of Ohio are exempt from the Fireworks Law's provisions regarding the manufacture, transportation, storage, and possession of pyrotechnic devices. The act establishes the state militia covered by the exemption is the militia of the state that is recognized by the Adjutant General of Ohio.¹⁶

Effective July 1, 2022

The remainder of the act's provisions take effect July 1, 2022.¹⁷ Those provisions are discussed here.

Consumer-grade fireworks

Purchase and possession

Under continuing law, "1.4G fireworks" are consumer grade fireworks designated under division 1.4 of the U.S. Department of Transportation's regulations.¹⁸ The act continues to allow individuals to possess consumer fireworks but eliminates, beginning July 1, 2022, the requirement that individuals transport consumer grade fireworks out of the state within 48 hours of their purchase.¹⁹

Use and regulation

Beginning July 1, 2022, any person who is authorized to possess consumer grade fireworks under the act may set those fireworks off, either on the person's own property or on another person's property with permission, on specific days. Those days are:

- New Year's Day;
- Chinese New Year;
- Cinco de Mayo;
- Memorial Day weekend;
- Juneteenth;
- July 3, 4, and 5, and the Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays preceding and following;
- Labor Day weekend;
- Diwali;
- New Year's Eve.

Consumer grade fireworks set off in accordance with this authorization are not considered a “public exhibition” and are therefore not subject to additional state regulations for public exhibitions.²⁰ Consumer discharge is, however, subject to local regulation, as the act specifically permits a county (with respect to its unincorporated territory), township (with respect to its unincorporated territory), or municipal corporation to restrict the dates and times that a person may discharge consumer fireworks, or impose a complete ban. Additionally, the act’s consumer fireworks changes do not limit the enforcement of an ordinance, resolution, or statute that regulates noise, disturbance of the peace, or disorderly conduct.²¹

Safety glasses and pamphlets required

Beginning July 1, 2022, any licensed retailer, licensed manufacturer, or licensed wholesaler selling consumer grade fireworks, other than to a licensed manufacturer, wholesaler, or exhibitor, must offer safety glasses for free at the point of sale, or make them available to the purchaser for a nominal charge. The retailer, manufacturer, or wholesaler must also provide purchasers with a safety pamphlet that contains certain minimum information detailed in the act.

A licensed retailer, manufacturer, or wholesaler who negligently fails to comply with the pamphlet or safety glasses requirement is guilty of a second degree misdemeanor.²²

Display-grade fireworks

Under continuing law, “1.3G fireworks” are display-grade fireworks designated under division 1.3 of the U.S. Department of Transportation’s regulations.²³ The act eliminates, beginning July 1, 2022, the requirement that a nonresident may possess display fireworks in Ohio only while directly transporting the fireworks out of Ohio, and that the nonresident do so within 48 hours of purchase. The act maintains, however, a criminal prohibition on a nonresident’s failure to transport display fireworks out of Ohio within 72 hours, a first degree misdemeanor.

The act also maintains requirements that individuals purchasing display-grade fireworks do so only from licensed fireworks manufacturers and wholesalers and that manufacturers and wholesalers only sell display fireworks to persons who have an appropriate license.²⁴

New prohibitions

The act prohibits, beginning July 1, 2022, any person from negligently using fireworks while in possession or control of, or under the influence of, any intoxicating liquor, beer, or

controlled substance. A person who violates this prohibition is guilty of a first degree misdemeanor. The act also specifies that, regardless of any other law that specifies otherwise, a person may be convicted of both that violation and a disorderly conduct violation for the same underlying conduct.

Additionally, the act prohibits, beginning on the same date, any person from negligently discharging, igniting, or exploding fireworks on another person's property without that person's permission. A person who violates this prohibition is guilty of a minor misdemeanor.²⁵

Licensee discipline

Continuing law allows the State Fire Marshal to revoke, or deny renewal of, a fireworks manufacturer or fireworks wholesaler license if the licensee has violated the Fireworks Law or the State Fire Marshal's rules. The act adds provisions allowing suspension of a license, but leaves the State Fire Marshal's ability to revoke, or deny renewal of, a license in place.²⁶

Exemptions to the Fireworks Law

Licensing variances

Prior law allowed the State Fire Marshal to grant variances to the Fireworks Law's prohibitions against the possession and use of pyrotechnic compounds to a person who possesses those compounds for personal and noncommercial use as a hobby. The act amends the variance authority by defining "hobbyist activities," limiting the amount of materials a variance allows, adding requirements for variance applications, and limiting the State Fire Marshal's ability to deny and revoke variances.

The act defines "**hobbyist activities**" as the manufacture, possession, and use of individual items, each of which meets the definition of either a 1.3G display firework or 1.4G consumer firework. It also limits a variance holder to possession of five pounds, in total, of explosives, pyrotechnics, or similar raw materials for, and finished 1.3G and 1.4G fireworks manufactured during, hobbyist activities.

A person seeking a variance under the new provisions must do the following:

- Demonstrate that they have the experience, education, and training necessary to protect public safety when engaging in hobbyist activities;
- Demonstrate that they have a safe and legal way to acquire, store, and use explosives, pyrotechnics, and similar raw materials for the manufacture of fireworks; and
- Provide any other information or records the State Fire Marshal considers necessary to protect public safety during a person's hobbyist activities.

Finally, the act prohibits the State Fire Marshal from unreasonably withholding a variance. It also changes the State Fire Marshal's authority to revoke a variance, which is discretionary under prior law, by requiring cause for revocation.²⁷

CHAPTER 511

Fireworks

511.01 Definitions.

511.01 DEFINITIONS.

As used in this chapter:

- (a) "1.3G fireworks." Display fireworks consistent with regulations of the United States Department of Transportation as expressed using the designation "Division 1.3" in Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations.
- (b) "1.4G fireworks." Consumer fireworks are consistent with regulations of the United States Department of Transportation as expressed using the designation "Division 1.4" in Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations.
- (c) "Beer." Has the same meaning as in R.C. § 4301.01.
- (d) "Booby trap." A small tube that has a string protruding from both ends that has a friction-sensitive composition and that is ignited by pulling the ends of the string.
- (e) "Cigarette load." A small wooden peg that is coated with a small quantity of explosive composition and that is ignited in a cigarette.
- (f) "Controlled substance." Has the same meaning as in R.C. § 3719.01.
- (g) "Discharge site." An area immediately surrounding the mortars used to fire aerial shells.
- (h) "Fireworks." Any composition or device prepared for the purpose of producing a visible or an audible effect by combustion, deflagration or detonation, except ordinary matches and except as provided in R.C. § 3743.80.

- (i) "Fireworks incident." Any action or omission that occurs at a fireworks exhibition that results in injury or death, or a substantial risk of injury or death, to any person, and that involves either of the following:
 - (1) The handling or other use, or the results of the handling or other use, of fireworks or associated equipment or other materials;
 - (2) The failure of any person to comply with any applicable requirement imposed by this section or R.C. Chapter 3743, or any applicable rule adopted under this section or R.C. Chapter 3743.
- (j) "Fireworks incident site." A discharge site or other location at a fireworks exhibition where a fireworks incident occurs, a location where an injury or death associated with a fireworks incident occurs, or a location where evidence of a fireworks incident or an injury or death associated with a fireworks incident is found.
- (k) "Fountain device." Means a specific type of 1.4G firework that meets all of the following criteria:
 - (1) It is non-aerial and non-report producing.
 - (2) It is recognized and manufactured in accordance with sections 3.1.1 and 3.5 of APA standard 87-1 (2001 edition).
 - (3) It is a ground-based or hand-held sparkler with one or more tubes containing a nonexplosive pyrotechnic mixture that produces a shower of sparks upon ignition, with or without additional effects that may include a colored flame, audible crackling effect, audible whistle effect, or smoke.
 - (4) It contains not more than 75 grams of the non-explosive pyrotechnic mixture in any individual tube and not more than 500 grams or less for multiple tubes.
- (l) "Highway." Any public street, road, alley, way, lane or other public thoroughfare.
- (m) "Intoxicating liquor." Had the same meaning as in R.C. § 4301.01.
- (n) "Licensed exhibitor of fireworks" or "licensed exhibitor." A person licensed pursuant to R.C. §§ 3743.50 through 3743.55.
- (o) "Licensed manufacturer of fireworks" or "licensed manufacturer." A person licensed pursuant to R.C. §§ 3743.02 through 3743.08.

- (p) "Licensed premises." The real estate upon which a licensed manufacturer or wholesaler of fireworks conducts business.
- (q) "Licensed wholesaler of fireworks" or "licensed wholesaler." A person licensed pursuant to R.C. §§ 3743.15 through 3743.21.
- (r) "Novelties" and "trick noisemakers."
 - (1) Devices that produce a small report intended to surprise the user, including but not limited to booby traps, cigarette loads, party poppers and snappers;
 - (2) Snakes or glow worms;
 - (3) Smoke devices;
 - (5) Trick matches.
- (s) "Party popper." A small plastic or paper item that contains not more than 16 milligrams of friction-sensitive explosive composition that is ignited by pulling a string protruding from the item, and from which paper streamers are expelled when the item is ignited.
- (t) "Processing of fireworks." The making of fireworks from materials all or part of which in and of themselves constitute fireworks, but does not include the mere packaging or repackaging of fireworks.
- (u) "Railroad." Any railway or railroad that carries freight or passengers for hire, but does not include auxiliary tracks, spurs and sidings installed and primarily used in serving a mine, quarry or plant.
- (v) "Smoke device." A tube or sphere that contains pyrotechnic composition that, upon ignition, produces white or colored smoke as the primary effect.
- (w) "Snake" or "glow worm." A device that consists of a pressed pellet of pyrotechnic composition that produces a large snake-like ash upon burning, which expands in length as the pellet burns.
- (x) "Snapper." A small paper-wrapped item that contains a minute quantity of explosive composition coated on small bits of sand and that, when dropped, implodes.
- (y) "Trick match." A kitchen or book match that is coated with a small quantity of explosive composition and that, upon ignition, produces a small report or a shower of sparks.
- (z) "Wire sparkler." A sparkler consisting of a wire or stick coated with a nonexplosive pyrotechnic mixture that produces a shower of sparks upon ignition and that contains no more than 100 grams of this mixture.

511.03 POSSESSION, SALE OR DISCHARGE PROHIBITED; EXCEPTIONS.

- (a) No person shall possess fireworks in this Municipality or shall possess for sale or sell fireworks in this Municipality, except a licensed manufacturer of fireworks as authorized by Ohio R.C. 3743.02 to 3743.08, a licensed wholesaler of fireworks as authorized by Ohio R.C. 3743.15 to 3743.21, a shipping permit holder as authorized by Ohio R.C. 3743.40, an out-of-state resident as authorized by Ohio R.C. 3743.44, a resident of this State as authorized by Ohio R.C. 3743.45, or a licensed exhibitor of fireworks as authorized by Ohio R.C. 3743.50 to 3743.55 and Section 1620.02 and except as provided in Section 1620.05.
- (b) Except as provided in Section 511.06 and except for licensed exhibitors of fireworks authorized to conduct a fireworks exhibition pursuant to Ohio R.C. 3743.50 to 3743.55 and Section 1620.02, no person shall discharge, ignite or explode any fireworks in this Municipality.
- (c) Except as provided in Section 511.06 and except for licensed exhibitors of fireworks authorized to conduct a fireworks exhibition pursuant to Ohio R.C. 3743.50 to 3743.55 and Section 1620.02, no person who owns, possesses, or manages real property in the City, including residential leasees, shall permit the discharge, ignition, or explosion of any fireworks on their premises. This is intended to be a strict liability offense.
- (d) No person shall sell fireworks of any kind to a person under eighteen years of age. No person under eighteen years of age shall enter a fireworks sales showroom unless that person is accompanied by a parent, legal guardian, or other responsible adult. No person under eighteen years of age shall touch or possess fireworks on a licensed premises without the consent of the licensee. A licensee may eject any person from a licensed premises that is in any way disruptive to the safe operation of the premises.
- (e) Except as otherwise provided in Ohio R.C. 3743.44, no person, other than a licensed manufacturer, licensed wholesaler, licensed exhibitor, or shipping permit holder, shall possess 1.3 G fireworks.

511.05 APPLICATION.

This chapter does not prohibit or apply to the following:

- (a) The manufacture, sale, possession, transportation, storage or use in emergency situations, of pyrotechnic signaling devices and distress signals for marine, aviation or highway use;
- (b) The manufacture, sale, possession, transportation, storage or use of fuses, torpedoes or other signals necessary for the safe operation of railroads;

- (c) The manufacture, sale, possession, transportation, storage or use of blank cartridges in connection with theaters or shows, or in connection with athletics as signals or for ceremonial purposes;
- (d) The manufacture for, the transportation, storage, possession or use by, or the sale to the armed forces of the United States and the militia of this state, as recognized by the Adjutant General of Ohio, of pyrotechnic devices;
- (e) The manufacture, sale, possession, transportation, storage or use of toy pistols, toy canes, toy guns or other devices in which paper or plastic caps containing twenty-five hundredths grains or less of explosive material are used, provided that they are constructed so that a hand cannot come into contact with a cap when it is in place for explosion, or apply to the manufacture, sale, possession, transportation, storage or use of those caps;
- (f) The manufacture, sale, possession, transportation, storage or use of novelties and trick noisemakers, auto burglar alarms or model rockets and model rocket motors designed, sold and used for the purpose of propelling recoverable aero models;
- (g) The manufacture, sale, possession, transportation, storage or use of wire sparklers.
- (h) The conduct of radio-controlled special effect exhibitions that use an explosive black powder charge of not more than one-quarter pound per charge, and that are not connected in any manner to propellant charges, provided that the exhibition complies with all of following:
 - (1) No explosive aerial display is conducted in the exhibition;
 - (2) The exhibition is separated from spectators by not less than two hundred feet;
 - (3) The person conducting the exhibition complies with regulations of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms of the United States Department of the Treasury and the United States Department of Transportation with respect to the storage and transport of the explosive black powder used in the exhibition.

511.07 PERMITTED CONSUMER USE

- (a) Any person who intends to obtain possession in this Municipality of 1.4G fireworks purchased in this state shall obtain possession of the 1.4G fireworks only from licensed retailers, licensed manufacturers, or licensed wholesalers and shall be subject to this section.

- (b) Any person authorized pursuant to Ohio R.C. 3743.45 to possess 1.4G fireworks in the State of Ohio may discharge, ignite, or explode those fireworks on private property with the authorization of the property owner on the following dates and their specified times.

(1) The first day of January from 12:00 AM until 1:00 AM

(2) The third, fourth, and fifth day of July from 8:30 PM until 11:00 PM

511.09 PROHIBITED USE

- (a) No person under the age of eighteen (18) shall use, possess, discharge, ignite, or explode any 1.4G fireworks in this Municipality.

- (b) No person shall use, possess, discharge, ignite, or explode any fireworks in this Municipality while under the influence of alcohol, a drug of abuse, or a combination of them.

511.99 PENALTY.

Except as otherwise provided, whoever violates any provision of this chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree and shall be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or imprisoned not more than six months or both.

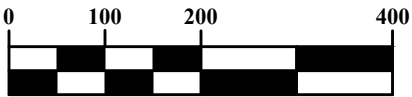

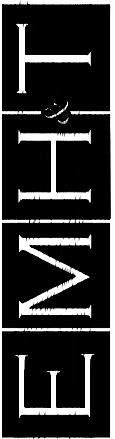
