

MINUTES REGULAR COUNCIL
REYNOLDSBURG CITY COUNCIL
April 23, 2012

President of Council Doug Joseph called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

Members of Council present: Mel Clemens, Barth R. Cotner, Chris Long, Nathan Burd, Scott A. Barrett, Leslie Kelly, Cornelius McGrady III.

The Invocation was given by Councilman Cotner. Mr. Joseph led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes of the regular Council meeting held April 9, 2012 were approved without objection.

The agenda was approved.

Community Comments and Requests

a. Reynoldsburg Lions Club - Pre-School Vision Project - drawing:

Norm Brusk thanked Council for allowing the Reynoldsburg Lions Club to hold their drawing for their project on screening preschool children for potential eye problems. The Lions Club plans to purchase an instrument that's specifically designed for preschool children, and they will be doing free screenings throughout the community. Mayor McCloud drew the winning ticket for a scarlet and gray scooter, and the winner was Miles Drake.

b. Reynoldsburg Lions Club - presentation of information regarding fund-raiser:

Kathy Baker, President of the Reynoldsburg Lions Club, thanked Council for allowing the informational presentation to be made regarding another fund-raiser the club would be pursuing. The event would have the Carson & Barnes Circus come to town and would provide an opportunity to bring a family-owned circus to the City of Reynoldsburg so that it would allow it not only to be a fund-raiser for the Reynoldsburg Lions, but also be a good, family-filled event, and bring in some awareness to the City of Reynoldsburg. Ms. Baker said they were hoping to bring the circus in for July 26, a Thursday; that they were working in conjunction with the Parks and Recreation, Mr. Jason Shamblin; and said they had discussed it already with the Mayor and the City Attorney. Ms. Baker said she was just bringing the topic forward for informational purposes, and asked if there were any questions.

Mr. McGrady: The Carson & Barnes Circus - will there be any liability to the city or any cost to the city?

Ms. Baker: No, there will not be any liability associated to the city. The city will however, be named on the policies. The circus is actually carrying the liability for that and we have asked them to increase it from a million to five million for the policy, and so it will be sponsored through the Reynoldsburg Lions and then so, but anything like with the Parks and Recreation - the city will be named on their policy, but it will not be a cost to the city.

Mr. McGrady: With the animals that they have there, who will be responsible for the trash

collection, or will that be part of the contract?

Ms. Baker: The circus is totally responsible for the trash pickup and the cleaning of the entire yard before they leave. We are responsible from Reynoldsburg Lions to provide them with two six-yard waste containers, and so we'll be providing that, and that will include the animal waste that's in there. So as long as we provide them with the containers, we're working through again, the Parks and Recreation for us to be able to get those six-yard containers, and the circus per their contract, is responsible for picking up all the trash and they will provide restrooms; they have a big trailer of restrooms - they'll haul that in, haul that out.

Mr. McGrady: On the restrooms - so they'll have a potable water tanker on that?

Ms. Baker: We will provide them with a thousand gallons of water and we've already looked into the Water Department, and it'll cost us \$6.12 for that. And what we do is, we fill up their tanker and then they provide that for their animals.

Mr. McGrady: So it sounds as if Carson & Barnes is a self-sufficient operation.

Ms. Baker: They are. They produce their own energy and everything, their own power.

Mr. McGrady: Okay, so generators. Thank you.

Mr. Joseph asked if there were other questions.

Mr. Burd: I think it sounds really fun and unique. Where will it be held in the city?

Ms. Baker: We are going to have it at Civic Park. We'll sign a rental agreement with the parks.

Mr. Burd: Good place. Thank you.

Mr. Joseph: Thank you very much.

Michelle Ray to the 2012 Charter Review Commission.- -Mr. Long moved adoption. Mrs. Kelly seconded. With the roll called, members voted: Mr. Clemens “Yea”; Mr. Cotner “Yea”; Mr. Long “Yea”; Mr. Burd “Yea”; Mr. Barrett “Yea”; Mrs. Kelly “Yea”; Mr. McGrady “Yea”. Motion passed.

Motion passed; Ordinance No. 21-12 adopted.

ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF REYNOLDSBURG, OHIO: Amending Table 1155: Zoning Code Fees of Chapter 1155 ENFORCEMENT; PENALTY.- -Clerk read ordinance by title for the third reading. Mr. Cotner moved to amend the legislation to include the document with additional updates, received by Council on March 14, 2012. Mr. Clemens seconded. With the roll called, members voted: Mr. Clemens “Yea”; Mr. Cotner “Yea”; Mr. Long “Yea”; Mr. Burd “Yea”; Mr. Barrett “Yea”; Mrs. Kelly “Yea”; Mr. McGrady “Yea”. Motion passed; ordinance amended.
