JANUARY, 2017 AUDITOR'S REPORTS

Clerk read the Budget by Classification and Departmental Budgets for January, 2017 into the minutes.

Reports

Mr. Spalding: We are honored to have the leadership of the Southwest Licking Fire Department here, and to have them take care of our Reynoldsburg residents that live in Licking County. They do a fantastic job. From the reports we have seen in the past, by putting the EMT station at Taylor Rd., it is amazing the number of lives they have saved and how fast they get to the scene. I will turn it over to the Chief.

Chief Majors: Thanks for letting us come down. We have had a lot of changes in our administrative staff, so we wanted to come in so that you could put a face with the name and talk about what we have done for the citizens of the citizens of Licking County that are in the Reynoldsburg area. First, I will introduce everyone. I am Todd Magers, I am the Fire Chief. I have Assistant Chief Jack Treinish, and our District Administrator, Steve Little with us tonight. We also have some handouts that we what to give you to go over some of the stuff that we have done recently here in the Reynoldsburg area. Assistant Chief Treinish will had these out and then we will go over these. As Mr. Spalding mentioned, we did put a station on Taylor Rd. We recognized the call volume in that area. That Taylor Road corridor between Board and Palmer Road, with the housing additions through there, there is about a thousand calls a year. We were not getting that response time into that call volume like we wanted. So, we rented some office space and a garage in that area so that we could put a medic unit in there and work on response times. The first thing you want to take a

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look at is the map. That is the Reynoldsburg City area in Licking County. That shows you that there 1115 runs in that area. The average response time on those 1115 runs for fire response is over 8 minutes and our EMS response in there is over 7. That is why we put a medic unit in there. We cut those response times in half and we are getting a medic in there under five minutes. We have had that station in there about 6 months now, and in that six months period, we have already have 5 saves on cardiac arrest by getting that medic there that much quicker. *(Applause.)* The other map that we have shows you Station 404 that we are discussing. The heavy blue areas is that call volume that we are discussing along Taylor Rd. This gives you an idea of the concentration of runs in there. In that area, probably 90% are EMS calls. We wanted to share that information with you to let you know what we have going on in West Licking, and put a face with all the names.

Mr. Spalding: You guys are doing a great job. I have actually been able to visit every one of your stations and have met the many young men and young women that are under your command. I will tell you, great dedication and they really care about saving lives. That is what is all about with them and you cant be more sincere.

Mr. Long: Thank you very much, Gentlemen.

Mr. Skinner: For the couple of years that I was on, I loved working with these guys. They have great hearts and great servant attitudes. They were always on top of the cutting egde things. I can not say enough good things about these guys and I really commend you for everything that you are doing. On behalf of the City, thank you.

Mr. Long: Any other comments from Council? Thank you very much, Gentlemen.

Mr. Joseph: In two weeks is the deadline for anyone who wants to serve on the Charter Commission. Again, we are looking for five people who would be interested in serving on the Commission. Republicans, Democrats, Independents are welcome to apply. Two weeks will be when the recommended Charter Review Commission will be submitted to Council. Thank You.

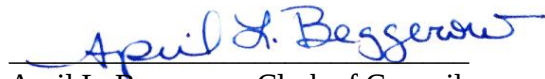

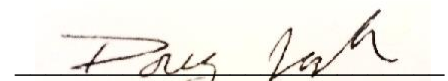
