Per your request, we are pleased to present the following additional information to clarify the Phase 1 efforts of our proposal for the subject project.

The purpose for Phase 1 is to, in essence, perform a “physical exam” on the site and existing facilities in order to identify assets, liabilities, opportunities, issues and constraints to guide the planning team; and build consensus with the Stakeholder group on recommendations for the next steps in the planning of the Master Plan. In short, “What is, or should be, the Vision for the upgraded park?”

Overarching major goals include:

- Identifying whether the existing recreational facilities can be salvaged, refurbished or repurposed.
- Identifying buildable area for new recreational/park facilities; or, just as important, what can't be built on the buildable area (i.e., a community center with a double gym).
- If we can't easily put a community center in the buildable area, identifying what recreational features can be relocated from Huber Park to free area for a large community center.

The bottom line is to create a mini-land-use plan that details a cost-effective Vision; and identifies the highest and best uses for the entire Huber Park to guide the efforts of the design team in the future planning phases of the Master Plan. We accomplish this by:

- A Kick-Off Meeting and Site Walk with the City and the Advisory Committee
- Completing a Site Inventory and Analysis
- Completing a Site Engineering Assessment

Dear Mr. Mayor McCloud:

We greatly appreciate the opportunity to have met with Nathan Burd, Dan Havener and you regarding your vision for the improvements to Huber Park with the acquisition of the old Swim Club property and the creation of a new community center. It is our hope that we can demonstrate our value and ability to produce an exceptional Master Plan that meets the goals of the City of Reynoldsburg.

The team that will provide the planning services will be led by:

- James H. Warner III, AIA, LEED® AP BD+C, Senior Architect
- David R. Parkinson, P.E., Senior Project Manager

Of course, you have known me for a long time; my understanding of the City's needs and history will provide trustworthy guidance to our design efforts. Although you have yet to meet Jim, he has many years serving local governmental clients (much as Reynoldsburg) from CT's new Southwest Office. He has been involved in numerous park master plans and designed several parks and community centers, including the award-winning Springdale Community Center in Springdale, Ohio.

Because of the many years of specialized parks and recreation experience, our inter-disciplinary team of architects, civil engineers and landscape architects is well equipped to produce a tightly integrated Master Plan for Huber Park.

We envision a four phase project which can be undertaken in separate funded phases. At this stage there are a number of options for how the latter phases can be performed; either a more high-level preliminary plan or a more detailed and fully developed plan.

Phase 1 - Inventory/Analysis

This phase will inventory planning characteristics (i.e. circulation, plantings, etc.), inventory site infrastructure and civil engineering aspects, and assessment of existing site and facilities.

Phase 2 - Programming and Visioning

This phase will include architectural programming for a proposed community center and some high level Visioning with City staff to develop options for the use of the site.

Phase 3 - Preliminary Master Plan

This phase will include development of two Preliminary Concept Master Plans, two architectural concepts for a Community Center, an order-of-magnitude project budget and a public hearing.

Phase 4 - Final Park Master Plan and Community Center Concept Design

This phase will include the development of a Final Master Plan, a Concept Design for a new Community Center, a project budget cost estimate and a public hearing.

The Scope of Services for Phase 1 is as follows:

a. Kick-Off Meeting

We recommend the formation of an Advisory Committee for this project. We will meet with the City and Advisory Committee and walk the site together. We will outline the master planning process; discuss specific goals and objectives; transfer site information; discuss elements of the site and program; create a list of stakeholder groups who should provide input in later phases; establish a communications protocol and agree upon a schedule.

b. Site Inventory and Analysis

We understand that, for the purposes of the Master Plan, we will utilize the GIS and/or site survey base data that will be provided to us by The City of Reynoldsburg (CT Consultants can provide surveying services upon request). We will spend time on site assessing its characteristics, observing how the property is being used now, gathering knowledge about the stream and floodway, and understanding how the property was used historically. We will also pull together information on the surrounding land uses, the existing Swim Club facilities, how people will get to the site, and views into and out of the site. We will perform a preliminary facility assessment of the former Swim Club facilities, including the Roller Rink, to determine what may be cost-effectively salvaged for reuse or adapted. We will identify assets, liabilities, issues and constraints for the whole park. In general, we will prepare and present the information that we feel is both responsible and inspirational for the development of the master plan, including site-specific and contextual mapping. The contextual analysis will also be used to diagrammatically portray larger linkages and opportunities relating to the site. We will compile base data and create simple, easy-to-understand inventory/analysis maps that communicate the important issues for consideration during Master Planning.

c. Site Engineering Assessment

The Site Engineering Assessment will include:

- Assessment of existing site topography, soils, vegetation, floodway, boundaries, and access.
- Evaluate existing utilities including sanitary sewer, water, gas, electric and communication.

- Analyze drainage hydrology and hydraulics including a high-level evaluation of the existing floodway and floodplain.
- Perform a records search to identify the general location of wetlands or other waters of the U.S.

d. Presentation of Findings

We will present the inventory/analysis and site engineering assessment work to the client and Advisory Committee at the City. We will seek input as to anything that was missed or misinterpreted, and we will make minor adjustments in preparation for the report. We will prepare a Phase 1 Inventory/Analysis report in a three ring binder (additional copies provided upon request at cost).

Fees:

Since the project is assumed to be undertaken in separate funded phases, we have included Phase 1 as a firm price; but have quoted an estimated fee range for the future phases, subject to determination of final scope of services.

MEMORANDUM

Date: February 11, 2015
To: Reynoldsburg City Council Members
Re: 2015 Street Program

This legislation would authorize EMH&T to begin design engineering and bidding services for the 2015 Street Program. The appropriation needed for design engineering and bidding services totals \$16,068 (identified as Part 1 page 4 of the EMH&T memo). After bids are received, we will return to Council with a contract. The anticipated total cost of the program including construction and all related engineering is likely to be \$925,000 to \$960,000.

The street repair needs throughout the city are numerous. With our limited financial resources, we are not able to undertake as large of a project as we would like. There are many roads throughout the city designated as poor or very poor. The roads we have identified for this year's program all have a pavement condition rating (PCR) below 70, identifying them as in very poor condition. The roads included in this proposal are:

Radekin Road (PCR of 32)
Mirandy Place (PCR of 46.6)
Needlewood Lane/Old Church Way (PCR of 58.6)
Trailblazer Way (PCR of 64.2)
Pathfinder Drive (PCR of 67.5)
Wigwam Way/Tomahawk Trail (PCR of 69.7)
Portions of Kingsley Drive (PCR of 67.8, possible alternate bid)

This year's street program proposal also includes the removal of the damaged brick crosswalks in Olde Reynoldsburg and the construction of a public parking lot in Olde Reynoldsburg. These items were approved last fall, but we were unable to secure a contractor due to the time of the year. Including them with the street program is preferable to doing them as separate projects.

We would like to have this legislation approved as an emergency preferably no later than the second reading so we can move quickly to secure a contractor and get the work started as soon as possible this spring. I'll speak on this item during the Feb. 17 Finance Committee agenda. Please let me know if you have any questions. Thank you.

Proposal for Construction Phase Engineering Services**

Dear Mr. Burd:

EMH&T is pleased to submit our proposal for design and construction phase services for the City's upcoming Street Maintenance Program, which will also include the rebidding and construction administration for the East Main Street Intersection and Parking Lot Improvement.

The East Main Street Improvements were previously bid in September 2014 with an engineer's estimate of \$308,000. The City did not receive bids from any of the contractors that purchased bid documents. The plan holders cited the short construction duration and lack of workforce availability as the primary reasons they did not submit a bid. We recommend rebidding the improvement with a slightly higher estimate and longer construction duration. Additionally, bidding this improvement with the Street Program will entice more paving contractors.

The 2015 Street Maintenance Program will include detailed evaluation, cost estimates, program exhibits and specification and bidding services. The following street segments are to be included in the program: Radekin Road, Mirandy Place, Needlewood Lane / Old Church Way, Trailblazer Lane, Pathfinder Drive, Wigwam Way / Tomahawk Trail, and the western section of Kingsley Drive (possible additional bid).

Based on previous meetings, it is our understanding that the construction budget for this improvements is:

- East Main Street Intersection and Parking Lot Improvements.....\$350,000
- Street Maintenance Program (Approx. 6-7 streets).....\$500,000
- TOTAL.....\$850,000

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Scope of Services for this improvement will be broken up into the following two parts:

- Part 1 – Field work, engineering design, and bidding services for the 2015 Street Program.
- Part 2 – Construction contract administration, and on-site representation for both the East Main Street Intersection and Parking Lot Improvements and the 2015 Street Maintenance Program.

Part 1

1. Street Maintenance Program Design Services
 - a. Conduct kick-off and progress meetings with the City throughout design
 - b. Gather necessary field data and measurements
 - c. Assess the curb ramps on candidate streets for ADA compliance

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- d. Perform pavement cores on candidate streets to assess their current thickness and condition.
- e. Prepare engineering quantity and cost estimates
- f. Develop street program exhibits
- g. Prepare detailed construction specifications

2. Bidding Services

- a. Prepare 20 sets of bidding documents and publish the notice to bidders
- b. Respond to any requests for information from bidders during the bidding process
- c. Attend bid opening
- d. Prepare bid tab, award recommendation and conformed copies of the contract documents

Part 2

3. Construction Management/Contract Administration:

- a. Conduct a preconstruction coordination meeting with the City, Contractor, Utilities, Police, Fire, and other stakeholders requested by the City.
 - i. EMH&T will provide the following for the meeting:
 - Meeting agenda
 - Sign-in sheet
 - Submittal log
 - Meeting minutes for the City and attendees
- b. Review shop drawings and submittals.
 - i. EMH&T will prepare a Submittal Log to coordinate, track and document submittals throughout the execution of the construction contract.
 - ii. Review submittals and shop drawings for conformance with the plans and specifications
 - iii. Provide to the City those submittals requiring specific comments such as MOT plans and resident/business notifications. EMH&T will meet with the Service Department to discuss these specific submittals and coordinate the comments/approval, as necessary.
 - iv. Copies of the shop drawings and submittals will be made available for the City.
- c. Prior to construction, EMH&T will prepare a pre-construction video to record and photo document pre-existing conditions.
- d. Conduct bi-weekly Progress Meetings (or as otherwise directed by the City) with the City, Contractor, and other project stakeholders as requested by the City.
 - i. EMH&T will provide for the meeting the following:
 - Meeting agenda
 - Sign-in sheet
 - Meeting minutes for the City and attendees
- e. EMH&T will have weekly meetings with the Contractor onsite to discuss their work plan for the current week and any changes or items which need to be addressed. EMH&T will coordinate with the City on the status and content of these discussions.
- f. Review initial and monthly schedule updates with respect to general project parameters and provide a copy of the schedules and EMH&T's comments to the City for review and comment.

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- g. EMH&T's project representative will provide a point of contact for residents, businesses, and traveling public. The Representative and the Contract Administrator will walk the project corridor prior to construction to introduce themselves and provide contact information to the businesses.
- h. EMH&T will maintain logs of quantities and prepare/generate pay documentation for City and contractor.
 - i. Maintain a log of quantities for payment.
 - ii. Generate monthly and final pay estimates.
 - iii. Review Contractor's claims and render an opinion as to whether or not Contractor's requests for additional compensation are justified.
 - iv. Maintain a record of the work performed to include correspondence and daily inspection reports.
- i. EMH&T will conduct final project walk through with the City and generate a punchlist.
 - i. Prepare punchlists for work performed not in accordance with the contract documents.
 - ii. Re-inspect punchlists until work is completed in accordance with the contract documents
 - iii. Submit a recommendation for acceptance of the project.
- j. Prepare a 1-Year warranty punchlist and coordinate with the Contractor to address required warranty work. EMH&T will coordinate with the City prior to conducting the 1-Year inspection to allow the City to provide input and participate in warranty inspection.

4. On-site Construction Representation:

- a. Provide on-site construction representation during the contract duration as required.
- b. EMH&T will observe construction activities performed by the Contractor and their subs and note whether the work is in conformance with the plans and specifications and measure project quantities for payment.
 - i. We will notify the Service Department of non-conforming work items and coordinate approval for any work stoppages to remedy non-conforming work through the City.
- c. The on-site representative will record their observations in a daily report and record the quantity of items performed and completed in conformance with the contract on a daily basis in a quantity log.
- d. Copies of the daily reports will be made available for the City to review in a manner to be determined by the City and after the 1-Year warranty.
- e. Review completed work and provide the City a recommendation for acceptance.

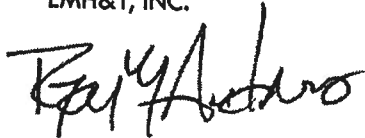

REYNOLDSBURG FIREWORKS DISPLAY CONTRACT

THIS CONTRACT AND AGREEMENT, for the sale and display of fireworks made and concluded this _____ day of _____, 2015, by and between **Pyrotecnico** of New Castle, Pennsylvania, and the **City of Reynoldsburg**, a chartered municipal corporation formed under the laws of the State of Ohio, hereinafter referred to as ("City").

WITNESSETH: For and in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained and other valuable consideration in hand paid, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and of the terms and conditions hereinafter mentioned, the parties to this contract do mutually and severally agree to perform their several and respective covenants and to guarantee terms, conditions, and payments of this contract.

1. Pyrotecnico agrees to sell, furnish, and deliver unto City fireworks to be exhibited in accordance with the programs set forth in the "Proposal for City of Reynoldsburg" in which are attached hereto and incorporated by reference into this contract as if fully restated.

2. Said fireworks to be furnished for display on the following date **July 3, 2015**, provided the weather permits a display. It being mutually understood and agreed that should inclement weather prevent the presentation of said display on said date, the date of **July 5, 2015** will be the "**rain date**" of the event. It being mutually understood and agreed that should inclement weather prevent the presentation of said display on said "**rain date**", a meeting of the parties will be held to discuss the postponement date(s). It is agreed to and understood by the parties hereto that in the event the fireworks have been taken out and set up before the inclement weather and with good weather prevailing, then such exhibition of fireworks must be carried out in the safest manner without any deductions whatever from the hereinafter named compensation.

3. If, due to the occurrence of a contingency as described above, with the aforementioned dates it is in Pyrotecnico's professional opinion with a reasonable degree of certainty, impossible or impracticable to present the display at the dates and times specified, Pyrotecnico and the City will confer with a view towards reaching a mutually satisfactory postponement date. In the event that the mutually satisfactory postponement date is beyond the date following the scheduled exhibition and Pyrotecnico personnel and equipment are required to return to their original point of origin, then the City shall be obligated to pay an additional charge of 15% of the contract price for transportation and travel of material and personnel back to the display site. In the event a mutually satisfactory postponement date cannot be determined, or if once determined, that postponement date must, due to any such contingency, be likewise postponed, then and in such event the City shall have no obligation to pay the remaining balance of the sum to be paid hereunder, and the deposit previously made by the City shall be returned to the City forthwith, less any and all reasonable expenses incurred by Pyrotecnico in anticipation of presenting such display, including, but not limited to, costs associated with set-up and takedown of equipment, and transportation of materials and Pyrotecnico personnel.

4. Pyrotecnico agrees to furnish unto the City one or more trained (pyrotechnic) personnel to present the said display. The City agrees to procure and furnish a suitable place to display said fireworks, and to secure all applicable police, fire, local, state, and federal governmental permits, licenses, and approvals.

5. The City agrees to indicate that Pyrotecnico is the organization responsible for exhibiting the fireworks on the said date in all advertisements, billings, and public relations materials.

6. The City agrees to furnish to Pyrotecnico ample police and fire protection for the protection of its property and the firing of the exhibition without interference from the public.

7. The City agrees to furnish and set up restraining lines pursuant to the instructions supplied by Pyrotecnico and in compliance to all rules, orders, and regulations of the National Fire Protection Association.

8. The City agrees to furnish adequate protection and security of the exhibition grounds to preclude all individuals other than those authorized by Pyrotecnico from entering the security area. No personal property of any kind, including but not limited to motor vehicles shall be allowed within the "safe zone". Prior to, during, and immediately following the display, the City shall be solely responsible to furnish and set up restraining lines for keeping all persons (except the trained personnel and their designated help) out of the danger area and behind the safety zone lines. This paragraph does not eliminate Pyrotecnico's obligation to provide security at all times, once the fireworks are inside the City or Township.

9. The City agrees to furnish to Pyrotecnico the sum of \$26,250.00 (the "Contract Price") paid as follows: a. 50% of the Contract Price due upon the signing of the contract; b. the balance of the Contract Price due within ten (10) days of completion of the Fireworks exhibition. The City agrees to pay interest at the rate of 1.5% per month on any delinquent balance of the Contract Price until paid in full. Payment shall be made by certified check or otherwise as agreed by Pyrotecnico to Pyrotecnico at P.O. Box 149, New Castle, Pennsylvania 16103. Furthermore, in the event the City fails to perform its obligations and responsibilities as set forth herein and it becomes necessary for Pyrotecnico to enforce its rights by hiring an attorney, the City shall be responsible for all attorneys' fees and costs incurred by Pyrotecnico to collect said sums.

10. Pyrotecnico agrees to name the City of Reynoldsburg and Truro Township as additional insured on a Ten Million Dollar (\$10,000,000) non-waste liability insurance coverage and supply the City with evidence of said coverage.

11. The City agrees to indemnify Pyrotecnico and hold its shareholders, directors, officers, employees, agents, representatives, and insurers harmless from any and all demands, claims, causes of action, judgments or liability (including the cost of suit and reasonable costs of experts and attorneys) arising from damage to or destruction of property (including real and personal) or bodily or personal injuries (including death) whether arising in tort, contract, or otherwise, that occur directly or indirectly from (a) the **gross negligence** or **willful misconduct** of the City or its employees, agents, contractors, or representative, or (b) the failure of the City to comply with its obligations and responsibilities as set forth herein.

12. Pyrotecnico agrees to indemnify the City and hold its employees, officials, agents, representatives, and insurers harmless from any and all demands, claims, causes of action, judgments or liability (including the cost of suit and reasonable costs or experts

and attorneys) arising from damage to or destruction of property (including real and personal) or bodily or personal injuries (including death), whether arising in tort, contract, or otherwise, that occur directly or indirectly from the **gross negligence** or **willful misconduct** of Pyrotecnico or its employees, agents, contractors, or representatives.

13. Pyrotecnico agrees to notify Truro Township Fire Department (TTFD) immediately when the vehicle carrying the fireworks arrives in the City of Reynoldsburg. Pyrotecnico agrees to furnish a 24 hour guard, at their sole cost, with the vehicle during the time it is in the City of Reynoldsburg or Truro Township. Pyrotecnico agrees to inspection of fireworks mortar racks that are encased in wood, if deemed necessary by TTFD, then wood will be replaced with undamaged lumber. Pyrotecnico agrees to secure, fireworks mortar racks and cakes, to the ground according to specification and jurisdictional authority. Pyrotecnico agrees to furnish and employ an electronic firing system. Pyrotecnico agrees to furnish and employ protective clothing required by the Ohio Fire Code and NFPA 1123. Pyrotecnico agrees to furnish a letter to TTFD stating that all mortars to be used for the exhibition are made of approved material, of sufficient strength, length and durability to cause shells to be propelled to a safe altitude as required by Ohio Fire Code and NFPA 1123.

14. Neither party, under any circumstances, shall be entitled to recover any consequential, incidental, exemplary, special, and/or punitive damages from the other party to this agreement, including, without limitation, loss of income, business or profits.

15. In the event of fire, flood, Acts of God, or other causes beyond the control of Pyrotecnico, which prevents the delivery of said materials, the parties hereto release each other from any and all performances of the covenants herein contained and from damages resulting from the breach thereof.

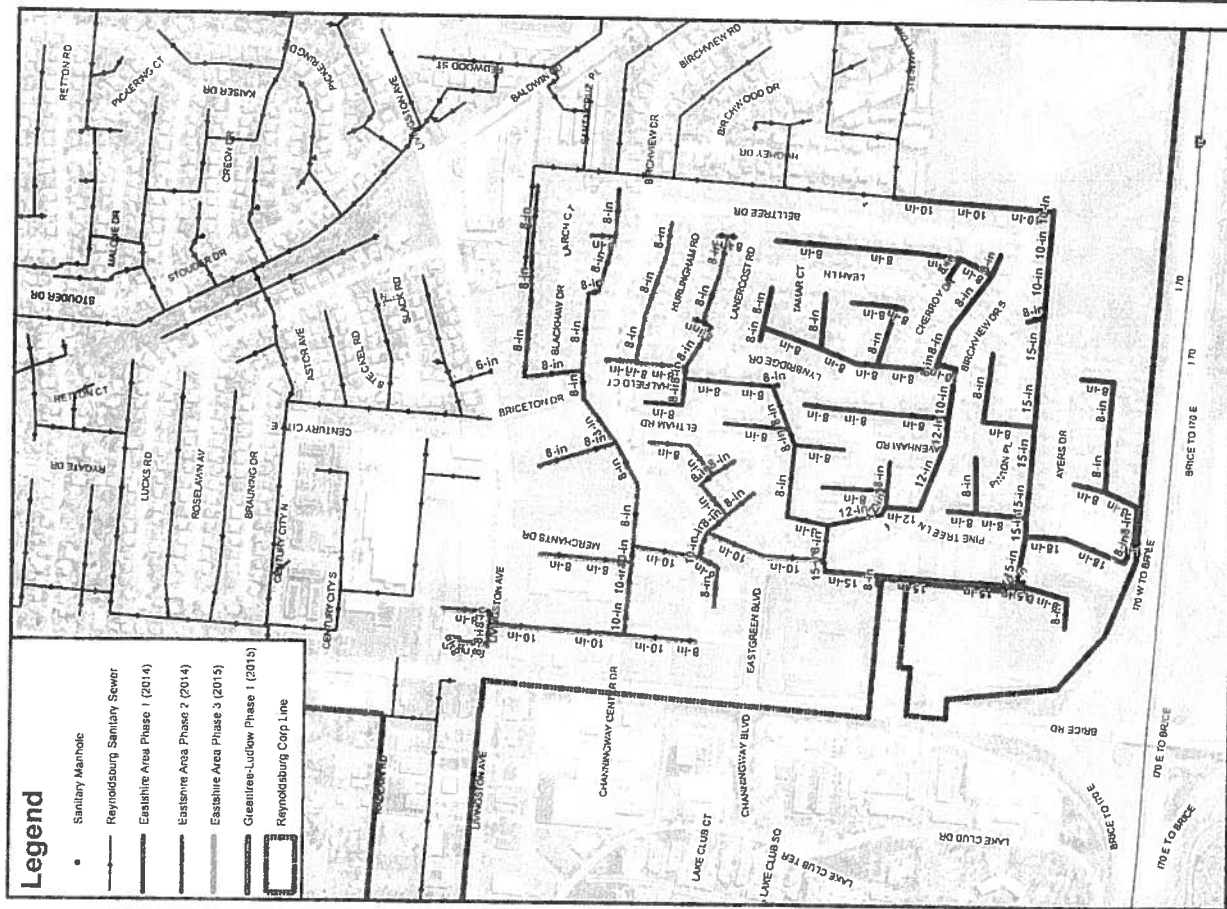

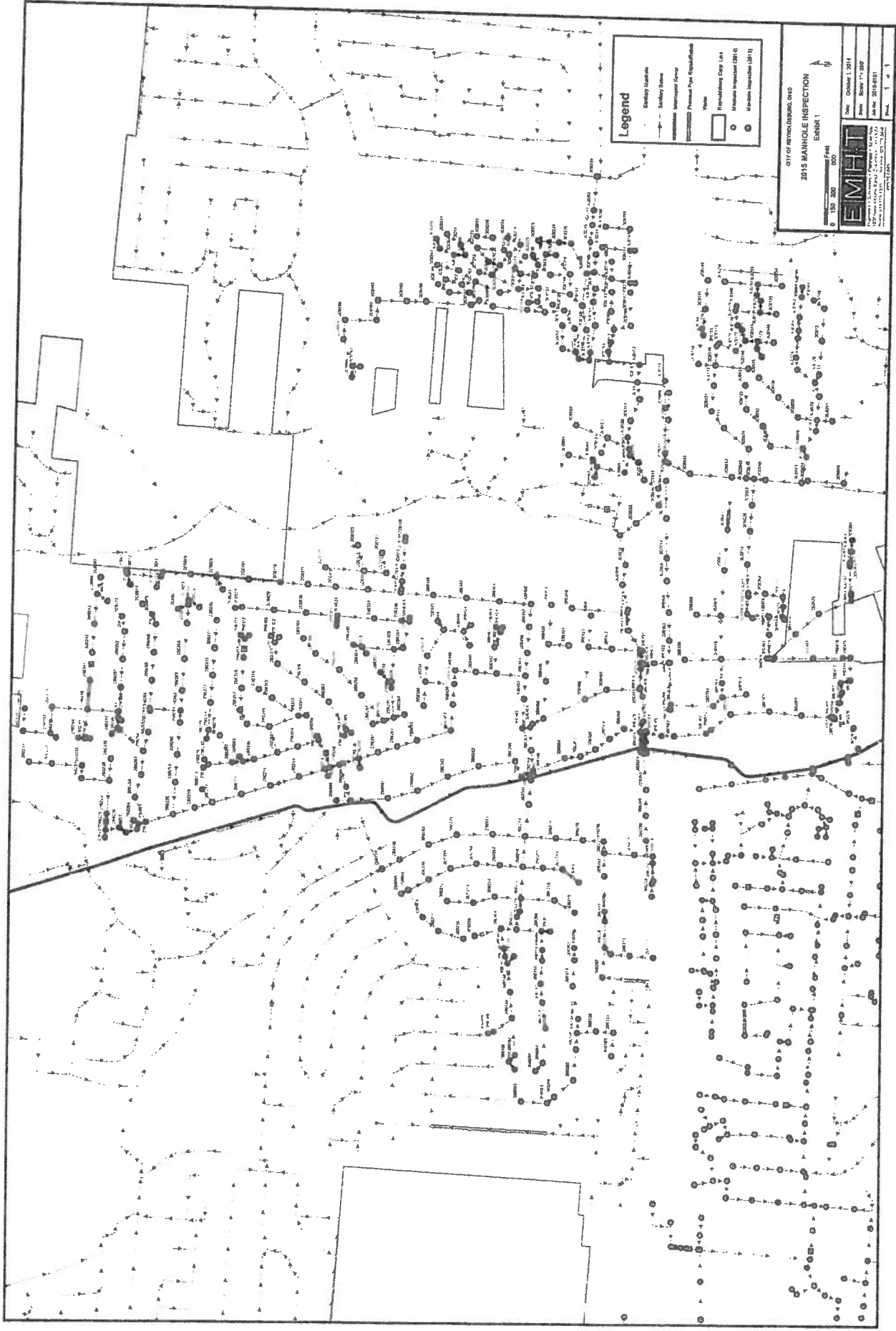

I would like to ask that you waive competitive bidding in order for us to purchase a Vacall sweeper from Best Equipment on an N.J.P.A. (National Joint Powers Alliance) bid. Without this cooperative contract program the price of this Vacall would be substantially higher. There are three different styles of street sweepers on the market; mechanical, regenerative, and vacuum. Over the past several years we have researched and demoed many brands and styles of street sweepers to come up with a unanimous decision from myself, our operators and mechanics in favor of a vacuum sweeper to clean up the city. We have owned our current Vacall for seventeen years while most cities' replace sweepers after five or ten years. There are only two vacuum sweepers on the market and while the prices might be similar we believe the Vacall has better performance and options. In your packets are some pictures and examples of the tasks the sweeper will be used for.

1. Street sweeping (on our terms and times) special events
2. Clean up during inlet replacement
3. Emergency spill clean ups (concrete, dirt, gravel, auto accidents)

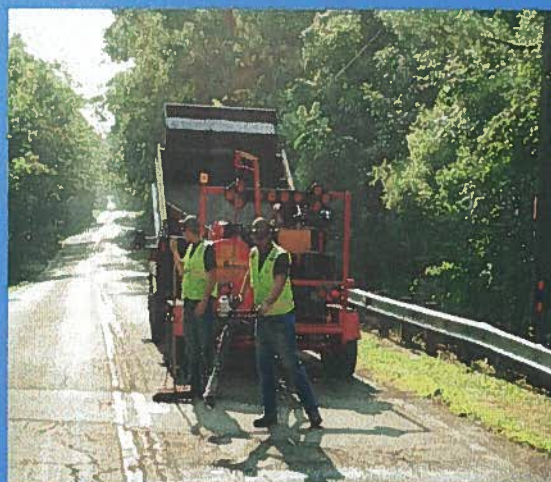

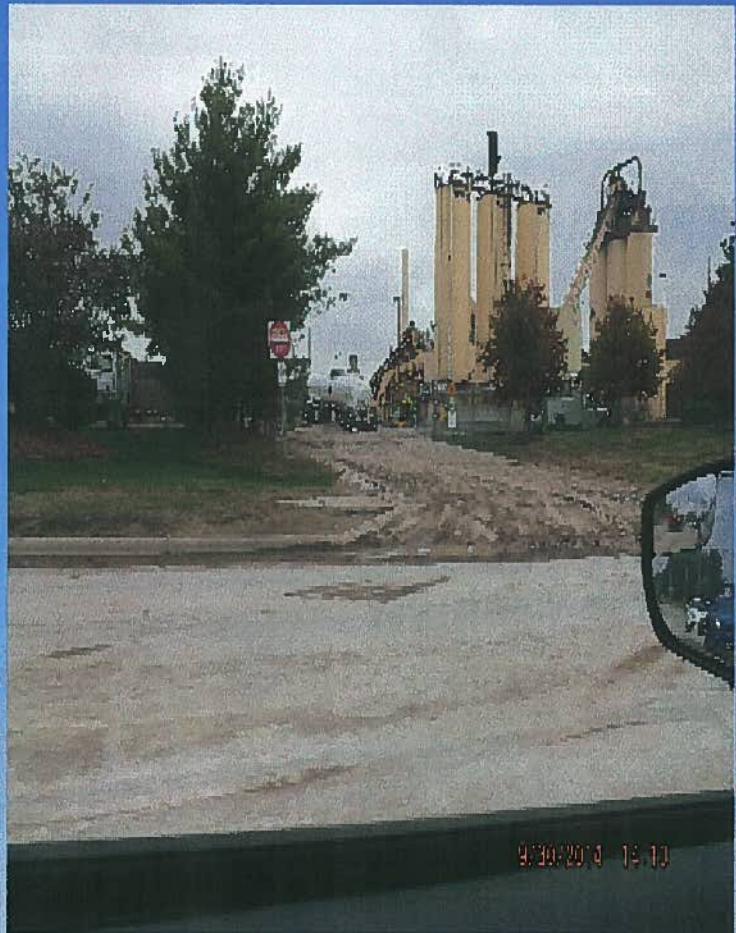
