Mr. Deskins: I'll call to order the Finance Committee Meeting at 7:32 p.m. First thing on the agenda this evening is the agenda. Hearing no changes to the agenda, it will stand as written. Next is Item No. 3a, approval of the minutes from December 20, 2010. Hearing no changes, the minutes will stand as written. Next is 3b, approval of the minutes for January 4, 2011 Finance Committee Meeting. No changes on the minutes, it'll stand as written.

Item No. 4 - Discussion: Resolution - "Ronald Reagan Day". Our Councilman Doug Joseph is presenting this. Doug, come on up.

Mr. Joseph: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. About a little over a year ago, an organization called the Ronald Reagan Legacy Project was established with the idea of commemorating and celebrating the 100th Anniversary of President Reagan's birth, and part of the process was to encourage legislative bodies all over the country to pass a resolution to that effect, and I will read into the record the resolution that I've had prepared for the City of Reynoldsburg.

Resolution to Recognize February 6, 2011 as "Ronald Reagan Day" in the City of Reynoldsburg, Ohio. Whereas President Ronald Wilson Reagan, a man of humble background, worked throughout his life serving freedom and advancing the public good, having been employed as an entertainer, corporate spokesman, governor of California, and President of the United States; and whereas, Ronald Reagan served with honor and distinction for two terms as the 40th President of the United States of America; the second of which he earned the confidence of 3/5 of the electorate and was victorious in 49 of the 50 states in the general election - a record unsurpassed in the history of American presidential elections; and whereas, in 1981, when Ronald Reagan was inaugurated President, he inherited a disillusioned nation shackled by rampant inflation and high unemployment; and whereas, during Mr. Reagan's presidency, he worked in a bipartisan manner to enact his bold agenda of restoring accountability and common sense to Government which led to unprecedented economic expansion and opportunity for millions of Americans; and whereas, Mr. Reagan's commitment to an active social policy agenda for the nation's children helped lower crime and drug use in our neighborhoods; and whereas, President Reagan's commitment to our armed forces contributed to the restoration of pride in America, her values and those cherished by the free world, and prepared America's Armed Forces to meet 21st Century challenges; and whereas, President Reagan's vision of "peace through strength" led to the end of the Cold War and the ultimate demise of the Soviet Union, guaranteeing basic human rights for millions of people; and whereas, February 6, 2011, will be the 100th Anniversary of Ronald Reagan's birth, and the seventh since his passing; Now,

Therefore Be It Resolved That, we the Council of the City of Reynoldsburg, Ohio do hereby declare February 6th, 2011, to be Ronald Reagan Day in Reynoldsburg, Ohio and urge all the citizens of the City of Reynoldsburg, Ohio to take cognizance of this event and participate fully in its observance.

In addition to Reynoldsburg, like I said, State of Ohio will be, the Legislature will be passing a similar resolution honoring President Reagan, and as someone who grew up as a young man with President Reagan as our leader, I can say that many people in public service today got their start by looking to President Reagan. I was one such person, both as a High School student and a College student during his years. So I hope that Council's had a chance to review the resolution and/or motion. I hope we can have support for this tonight. Thank you.

Mr. Deskins: Thank you, Councilman Joseph. Is there any questions from anyone in the Committee? Anyone from Council? Then I'll make a motion to send this to Council for approval. Seconded by Mr. Joseph. Any questions from the Committee or Council? **All in favor vote "Aye". (All voted "Aye") Opposed. (No response)** Motion passes.
