It will be for a D2, D3 and D6. The D2 permit allows for wine and mixed beverage consumption on premises until 1:00am or carry out in sealed containers. The D3 permit allows for the consumption of spirituous liquor on premises until 1:00am. The D6 permit allows for the sale of intoxicating liquor on Sundays between 10:00am and midnight. Anything that can be carried out must be in original container. It is not located in an area that would have adverse effect on the operation of any hospitals, schools, or playgrounds. 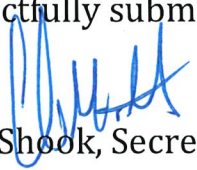

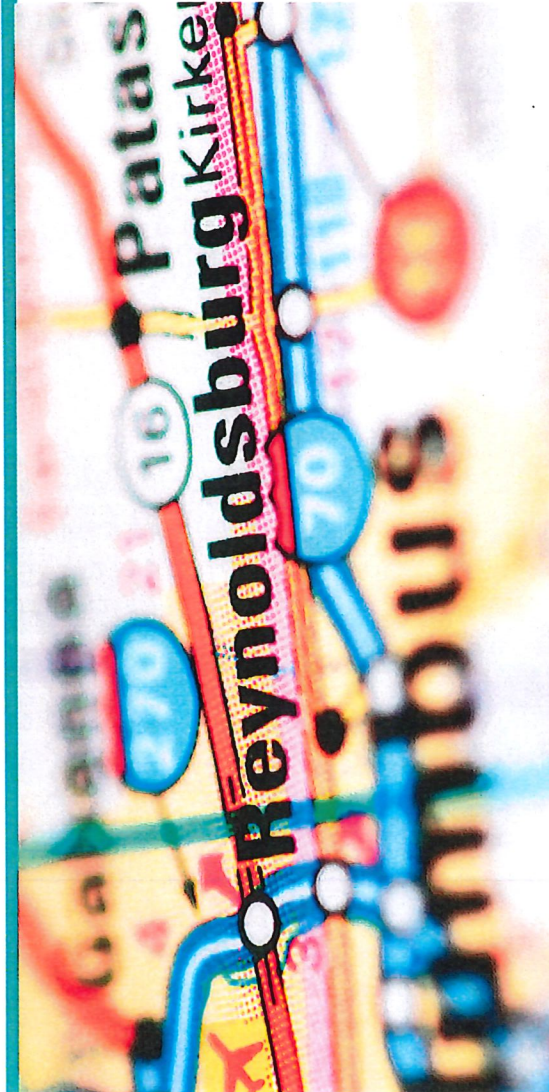

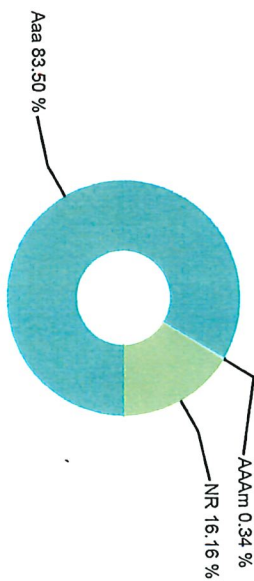

An Ordinance to Establish Section 701.07 of the Codified Ordinances, of the City of Reynoldsburg, Commonly Referred to as Pay to Stay

Section 1.

That Section 701.07 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Reynoldsburg be established as follows:

701.07 RESIDENTIAL TENANT’S RIGHT TO PAY TO STAY

- (a) At any time prior to the filing of an action for forcible entry and detainer under Ohio Revised Code Chapter 1923 for nonpayment of rent by a landlord, a Residential Tenant shall have the right to pay the landlord all past due rent with reasonable late fees to avoid the filing of such action for the restitution of the land or tenements.
 - (1) If the Residential Tenant tenders all accrued rent and reasonable late fees to the landlord, the landlord shall accept the tendered payment and allow the Residential Tenant to maintain the tenancy.
 - (2) If the Residential Tenant tenders all past due rent with reasonable late fees to the landlord prior to the filing of an action under Ohio Revised Code Chapter 1923 and the landlord refuses the tender, the Residential Tenant’s tender of all past due rent with reasonable late fees shall be an affirmative defense to any action filed by the landlord against the Residential Tenant for nonpayment of rent.
- (b) After the filing of an action for forcible entry and detainer under Ohio Revised Code Chapter 1923 for nonpayment of rent but prior to judgment, the Residential Tenant shall have the right to pay the landlord all past due rent, reasonable late fees, and court costs for the purpose of maintaining the tenancy.
 - (1) If the Residential Tenant tenders all past due rent amounts, including late fees and court costs, the landlord must accept payment. Upon receipt of the payment, the landlord shall dismiss the action against the Residential Tenant.
 - (2) If the Residential Tenant tenders all past due rent with reasonable late fees and court costs to the landlord prior to the judgment and the landlord refuses to tender, the Residential Tenant’s tender of all past due rent, reasonable late fees, and court costs shall be an affirmative defense to the eviction action filed by the landlord against the Residential Tenant for nonpayment of rent.
- (c) After the filing of an action for forcible entry and detainer under Ohio Revised Code Chapter 1923 for nonpayment of rent but prior to the execution of the eviction judgment through a writ of restitution, the Residential Tenant shall have the right to pay the landlord

all past due rent, reasonable late fees, and court costs, including the cost of obtaining the writ, so that the Residential Tenant may maintain the tenancy.

- (1) If the Residential Tenant tenders all past due rent amounts, including reasonable late fees and court costs, the landlord must accept the payment. Upon receipt of the payment, the landlord shall notify the appropriate court, who shall vacate the eviction judgment and dismiss the eviction action against the Residential Tenant.
 - (2) If the Residential Tenant tenders all past due rent with reasonable late fees and court costs to the landlord prior to the execution of the eviction judgment through a writ of restitution and the landlord refuses the tender, the bailiff shall not enforce the eviction judgment until the court instructs the bailiff to do so after an emergency hearing on the Residential Tenant's right to pay and stay at the premises. If the court finds during the emergency hearing that the Residential Tenant tendered all past due rent, reasonable late fees, and court costs, the court shall vacate the eviction judgment and dismiss the eviction action against the Residential Tenant.
- (d) Limitation of Affirmative Defense: The affirmative defenses provided by this Section to the Residential Tenant shall be the exclusive remedy for any violation by the landlord of this Section. The Residential Tenant's right to utilize the defenses available in subsections (a), (b), and (c) of this Section shall be limited to one (1) use per calendar year. Nothing in this Section shall limit the rights of a Residential Tenant to raise other affirmative defenses more than once in a calendar year.
- (e) This Section in no way limits the ability of a landlord to initiate, seek judgment, and the execution of a writ of restitution for forcible entry and detainer under Ohio Revised Code Chapter 1923 for reasons other than solely for non-payment of rent.
- (f) For purposes of this Section, no landlord may charge a late fee in an amount exceeding the larger of (i) twenty-five dollars (\$25.00); or (ii) five percent (5%) of the monthly contract rent.

An Ordinance to Establish Chapter 703 Single-Use Plastic Restrictions of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Reynoldsburg

Section 1.

That Chapter 703 shall be established as follows:

CHAPTER 703 SINGLE-USE PLASTICS RESTRICTIONS

703.01 DEFINITIONS.

As used in this chapter, except where the content clearly indicates a different meaning:

- (a) “Commercial Product in Quantity” means a quantity of 10 (ten) or more items marketed for retail sale.
- (b) “Compostable” products are defined as a product that has been certified as 100% compostable consistent with the timeline and specifications of the American Society of Testing and Materials (ASTM) Standard D6400 or the Biodegradable Products Institute (BPI) or equivalent, and is clearly marked as “compostable”.
- (c) “Customer” means any Person obtaining goods from a Store.
- (d) “Public Eating Establishment” means a restaurant, take-out food establishment or other business (including, but not limited to, food sales from vehicles or mobile vendors open to the public) that receives 90% or more of its revenue from the sale of prepared and ready-to-consume foods and/or drinks to the public.
- (e) “Recyclable” means any substance or object that is accepted for recycling by the City’s curbside recycling program, or that can reasonably be recycled at publicly available drop-off points within Franklin County at no cost to the individual.
- (f) “Recycled Content Paper Bag” means a paper bag provided by a Store to a Customer at the check stand, cash register, point of sale, or other location for the purpose of transporting food or merchandise out of the Store and that contains no old growth fiber and a minimum of forty percent (40%) postconsumer recycled material; is one hundred percent (100%) recyclable; and has printed in a highly visible manner on the outside of the bag the words “Recyclable,” the name and location of the manufacturer, and the percentage of post-consumer recycled content.
- (g) “Reusable Bag” means a bag with handles that is specifically designed and manufactured for multiple reuse and is (1) made of cloth or other machine washable fabric.

- (h) "Single-Use, Plastic Carryout Bag" means any bag that is made predominately of non-compostable plastic derived from petroleum or bio-based sources, except that Single-Use, Plastic Carryout Bags do not include Produce, Meat, or Product Bags.
- (i) "Store" means any commercial establishment operating from a permanent enclosed structure that sells perishable or nonperishable goods including, but not limited to, clothing, food and personal items directly to a customer.
- (j) "Take Out Food Containers" means a food container designed for made-to-order food to be carried off premises.

703.03 CARRYOUT BAG RESTRICTIONS

- (a) No Store shall provide a Single-Use, Plastic Carryout Bag to a Customer at the check stand, cash register, point of sale or other location for the purpose of transporting food or merchandise out of the Store as provided in this Section.
- (b) No Store may make available for sale a Recycled Content Paper Bag or Reusable Bag unless the amount of the sale of the Recycled Content Paper Bag and Reusable Bag is separately itemized on the sales receipt.
- (c) A Store or establishment is not responsible for the materials used by a party that may be renting a facility they own or operate.

703.05 PERMITTED BAGS

- (a) Nothing in this Ordinance prohibits Customers from using bags of any type that they bring to the Store themselves or from carrying away goods that are not placed in a bag.
- (b) Nothing in this Ordinance prohibits or in any way restricts any Store from providing a Compostable Single-Use Carryout or Compostable Reusable Bag.

703.07 OTHER SINGLE USE PLASTICS RESTRICTIONS

- (a) The City of Reynoldsburg shall prohibit the use, provision, and distribution of plastic beverage straws, plastic stirrers, plastic drink stoppers, or plastic cutlery at all City facilities and City-sponsored events.
- (b) Except as provided herein, no Store shall use, provide, or distribute plastic beverage straws, plastic stirrers, plastic drink stoppers, or plastic cutlery, with the exception of plastic straws, which may be provided to those with special needs upon request. Stores shall not be prohibited from selling any of these items packaged as a Commercial Product in Quantity for personal use.
- (c) No Educational Institution, or vendor serving on the premises of an Educational Institution, shall use, provide, distribute, or sell plastic beverage straws, plastic stirrers, plastic drink

stoppers, or plastic cutlery with the exception of plastic straws, which may be provided to those with special needs upon request.

- (d) Non-compostable or non-recyclable food containers or food container lids shall not be provided or distributed at City-sponsored events.
- (e) No Store shall provide or distribute non-Compostable or non-Recyclable Take Out Food Containers as part of a food purchase.

703.99 PENALTY

Whoever violates or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this chapter is guilty of a minor misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00). A separate offense shall be deemed committed each day during or on which a violation or noncompliance occurs or continues.

**AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH CHAPTER 176 DIVERSITY, EQUITY, AND
INCLUSION INTO THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF
REYNOLDSBURG, OHIO**

WHEREAS, the City of Reynoldsburg acknowledges that the history of discrimination in the United States of America continues to affect the privilege and/or lack of opportunity for women and minority owned small business in the United States, State of Ohio, and the City of Reynoldsburg; and

WHEREAS, the City of Reynoldsburg is one of the most diverse medium-sized communities in the State of Ohio and its municipal government's hiring and contracting procedures should reflect that diversity; and

WHEREAS, the City of Reynoldsburg will benefit from the identification of potential inequities in City services, contracting procedures, hiring, and decision-making processes; and from encouraging and empowering multicultural appreciation on the City; and

WHEREAS, the City of Reynoldsburg acknowledges its responsibility to ensure that women and minority owned small business have a fair and equitable opportunity to do business with the City of Reynoldsburg by and through the establishment of process and position within City government to identify such businesses, engage in outreach efforts to such businesses, and to incorporate these businesses into the City's contracting procedures; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Reynoldsburg now finds it appropriate to amend the City of Reynoldsburg Codified Ordinances to establish Chapter 176 Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REYNOLDSBURG, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That Part One of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Reynoldsburg be and the same is hereby amended to add Chapter 176 Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion to read as follows:

SECTION 2. That upon adoption by Council, this Ordinance shall be in effect thirty days following signature by the Mayor.

CHAPTER 176

DIVERSITY, EQUITY, AND INCLUSION

§ 176.01 Definitions. For the purpose of this Chapter, the following words, phrases and terms shall be defined as set forth below:

- (A) "Contract" shall mean a binding agreement between the City of Reynoldsburg and some other party(s) whereby the city expends its funds to:
- (1) Employ such party(s) for the construction of any public improvements; or
 - (2) Purchase any personal property; or
 - (3) Purchase services; or
 - (4) Lease any personal property from another party.
- (B) "Contract" does not include binding agreements between the city and some other party(s) whereby:
- (1) Any real property is leased to or from the city; or
 - (2) Any personal property is leased by the city to another; or
 - (3) Real property is purchased by or from the city; or
 - (4) The city agrees to provide services to some other party(s); or
 - (5) The agreement to provide services to the city will be totally fulfilled by a business entity with employees less than four (4) individuals; or
 - (6) The city contracts for services to be provided by another governmental agency; or
 - (7) The city establishes a contract with a not-for-profit entity; or
 - (8) The city establishes a contract for commodities with fixed prices; or
- (C) "Contracting agency" shall mean any agency authorized to act as an agent for the city to enter into a contract on behalf of the city.
- (D) "Controlled" for purposes of determining whether a business is minority-owned or women-owned (referred in this ordinance in combinations as "M/WBE") means the owner(s) shall:
- (1) Possess and exercise the legal authority and power to manage business assets, goodwill and daily operations of the business; and
 - (2) Actively and continuously exercise such managerial authority and power in determining the policies and directing the operations of the business.
- (E) "Minority-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE)" shall mean a business which is an independent and continuing operation for profit, performing a commercially useful function, and is owned and controlled by one or more eligible minority group members as defined by this code.

(F) "Minority Group Members" shall mean African Americans, Asian Americans, Hispanic Americans and Native Americans, all as defined by the US EEOC, legally residing in, or that are citizens of the United States or its territories.

(G) "Owned" shall mean:

- (1) At least fifty-one percent (51%) of the business is owned and controlled by individuals born or naturalized of the United States;
- (2) The ownership shall be real and continuing, and shall go beyond the mere indicia of ownership of the business reflected in the ownership document; and
- (3) The owner(s) shall enjoy the customary incidence of ownership and shall share in the risks and profits commensurate with their ownership interest, as demonstrated by an examination of the substance, rather than the form of ownership arrangements.

(H) "Women-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE)" shall mean a business which is an independent and continuing operation for profit, performing a commercially useful function, and is owned and controlled by one or more women that are U.S. citizens.

§ 176.03 Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Officer (DEI Officer)

(A) There is hereby created in the City of Reynoldsburg the position of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Officer (DEI Officer) who shall report directly to the Mayor and City Council. The DEI Officer shall be selected by a Committee consisting of the Mayor, Council President, Human Resources Director, and the Chairperson of the Public Service and Transportation Committee who shall submit the selection to City Council for approval by majority vote.

(B) The DEI Officer is dedicated to creating and implementing programs, policies and procedures that will deliver and capture value through supplier and workforce diversity. Additionally, the office will assist underserved, under-utilized and economically disadvantaged businesses with gaining greater access to procurement opportunities and resources to build viable and sustainable businesses. The DEI Officer shall have the following duties, responsibilities and authority:

- (1) Administration and enforcement of compliance with this Chapter;
- (2) Receiving and reviewing all rules and regulations issued by the State of Ohio or the federal government relevant to contract compliance, and assuring that the City is conforming to those rules or regulations
- (3) Reviewing ordinances authorizing the entry into contracts and certifying the proposed contractor's compliance prior to the ordinance being submitted to council
- (4) Certifying qualified business enterprises and monitoring their participation on city contracts to ensure compliance with this Chapter.

- (5) Establishment of written policy and procedures to execute this Chapter;
- (6) Development, refinement and coordination of supplier diversity and procurement activities such as outreach, solicitation for small contracts, bid specification review and prompt payment/contract dispute resolution procedures;
- (7) Investigation of alleged violations of this Chapter;
- (8) Analysis and review of programs on an annual, bi-annual or quarterly basis, and in accordance with the review and reporting requirements contained in this code;
- (9) Analysis, review and recommendation for adjustments to the city's annual participation goals;
- (10) Establish and review of all applicable specific contract participation goals;
- (11) Recommendations to the Mayor and City Council regarding additional efforts necessary to ensure the effective operation of this office pursuant to periodic review and reporting requirements contained in this code.

§ 176.05 Equal Employment Policy and Workforce Diversity

- (A) It shall be the policy of the City of Reynoldsburg to provide equal opportunity without regard to race, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, age, disability, familial status, natural hair types and natural styles commonly associated with race, or military status in hiring, tenure, training, terms, conditions or privileges of employment.
- (B) The DEI Officer may, in conjunction with City departments and management, develop guidelines, initiatives, and programs to help advance and promote workforce diversity in the City of Reynoldsburg.

§ 176.07 Outreach and Solicitation

- (A) The DEI Officer shall provide outreach efforts to solicit and encourage M/WBE to bid on city contracts. Specific "Outreach" efforts may be developed and coordinated by the DEI Officer, in conjunction with the appropriate departments and divisions.
- (B) The DEI Officer may provide for enhanced solicitation efforts to encourage M/WBEs to bid for small contracts.
- (C) The DEI Officer shall be responsible for providing a listing of certified M/WBE businesses. This listing is to be segmented or sorted into specific trades or lines of business (for each type of goods, services and construction purchased or contracted by the city) in accordance with this Chapter.
- (D) City agencies may be encouraged by the DEI Officer to eliminate any unnecessarily restrictive bid specifications that may adversely affect M/WBE participation.

§ 176.09 Good Faith Efforts. Good Faith Efforts are voluntary steps taken to demonstrate the willingness of a bidder to fulfill the City’s diversity and inclusion opportunity objective when bidding on a contract. Such good faith efforts shall be considered an important factor in determining the “lowest *and best*” bid for contracting purposes under Chapter 175.

In deciding that the bidder has made a good faith effort, the DEI Officer may consider specific documentation concerning the steps taken to obtain M/WBE participation, in accordance with the following factors:

- (A) Attended any pre-bid or pre-proposal meetings scheduled by the City department;
- (B) Followed up with M/WBEs that attended the pre-bid or pre-proposal meetings to discuss subcontracting and supplier opportunities and contacted M/WBEs listed in the City’s certification directory;
- (C) Conducted outreach with M/WBE focused organizations and associations far in advance of solicitation due date (no less than 10 business days);
- (D) Identified and designated portions of the work to be performed by M/WBEs to increase the likelihood of participation (including where appropriate breaking down the contract into reasonably sized subcontracts to ensure participation);
- (E) Advertising subcontracting opportunities focused towards minority and women-owned business persons far in advance of solicitation due date;
- (F) Provided M/WBEs with a point of contact that was knowledgeable about the project and possessed decision-making authority to answer questions from interested M/WBEs;
- (G) Provided a reasonable number of M/WBEs with timely written notices via email, mail, and/or fax and/or with documented contact regarding the subcontracting/supplier opportunities.
- (H) Followed up with the M/WBEs solicited to determine if they were interested in submitting a bid or proposal or participating on a team;
- (I) Provided interested M/WBEs certified to perform the solicited work with prompt access to the plans, specifications, scope of work and requirements of the contract;
- (J) Negotiated in good faith with interested M/WBEs;
- (K) Entered into a formal contract, or signing enforceable letters of intent with M/WBEs;

- (L) The DEI Officer may encourage a bidder to make additional efforts to utilize M/WBE subcontractors prior to contract award. These efforts could include but are not limited to contacting the ODI office for advice and guidance regarding “Good Faith Efforts.”

§ 176.11 Certification for Women and Minority-Owned Business Enterprise.

The DEI Officer shall be responsible for the certification and verification of M/WBE businesses located in the City of Reynoldsburg or within fifteen (15) miles of City limits. To be eligible for certification, each applicant must meet the definition of Minority-Owned Business or Women-Owned business as defined herein.

- (A) Any M/WBE business possessing a current certification from the State of Ohio as set forth in Ohio Revised Code Sections 123.151 and 123.154 shall be granted reciprocal certification by the DEI Officer.

- (B) The DEI Officer shall be responsible for implementing an additional certification process for those businesses not possessing M/WBE certification from the State of Ohio.

- (1) Any applicant must provide any and all materials and information necessary to demonstrate ownership and active participation in the control, operation, and management of the business.

- (2) The DEI Officer will review and evaluate any application and support documentation, and may reject the application based on one or more of the following:

- a. The applicant does not meet the requirements of the definition of a certified business.
- b. The application is not complete.
- c. The application contains false information.
- d. The applicant has not provided materials or information requested by the DEI Officer.

- (C) The DEI Officer will make a certification determination within 30 days after the date the city receives a satisfactorily completed application from the applicant. If certification is denied, the director will notify the applicant in writing and specify the reason(s) for denial.

- (D) The DEI Officer shall provide for all of the following:

- (1) A comprehensive certification system that is regularly updated and an on-line listing of certified businesses segmented into specific trades or lines of business (for each type of goods, services and construction purchased or contracted by the city).

- (2) Recertification of those businesses at least every three years.
- (3) Random on-site visits to verify ownership and control and compliance with certification requirements.
- (4) Decertification of any previously certified M/WBE upon a final determination that the firm is no longer satisfying the certification requirements. Any decertified M/WBE may appeal the determination of the ODI in accordance with the appeals procedure provided in this code.
- (5) Graduation of certified firms that exceeded the revenue or size standards to be established by the DEI Officer.

176.13 Contracting Agency Responsibility.

- (A) The contracting agencies of the City are directed to include the following equal opportunity clause in all contracts exceeding two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00). The inclusion of this clause may be waived by the DEI Officer where it is appropriate due to a similar clause requirement by state or federal law. The requirements contained in this clause will be considered by the DEI Officer in determining whether a contractor is in compliance with this Title.

“The contractor/vendor/bidder will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, age, disability, natural hair types and natural styles commonly associated with race, familial status or military status. The contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, age, disability, natural hair types and natural styles commonly associated with race, familial status or military status. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment up-grading, demotion, or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices summarizing the provisions of this Equal Opportunity Clause.”

- (B) It is the policy of the City of Reynoldsburg that business concerns owned and operated by M/WBEs shall have the maximum practicable opportunity to participate in the performance of contracts awarded by the city.
- (C) The contractor and each subcontractor will include a summary of this Equal Opportunity Clause in every subcontract. The contractor will take such action with respect to any subcontractor as is necessary as a means of enforcing the provisions of the Equal Opportunity Clause.

- (D) Failure or refusal of a contractor or subcontractor to comply with the provisions of this Chapter may result in cancellation of this contract.

§ 176.15 Department Contracting and Reporting Responsibilities.

Each City department has a vested interest in ensuring that the city of Reynoldsburg is a diverse and inclusive city. Therefore, each department will have the following responsibility:

- (A) Department directors or designees shall participate in a cross functional process, to track and report supplier diversity and workforce diversity initiatives.
- (B) Regular reports shall be filed by all City agencies on forms provided by the DEI Officer for the purpose of monitoring compliance with the provisions of this Chapter.
- (C) The DEI Officer shall be notified by the department director, contract administrator or department designee of any proposed subcontracting changes or contract issues that impact M/WBEs during the term of a contract. Additionally, the contract administrator shall notify the DEI Officer if the work of a subcontractor has been inspected and approved and the subcontractor, after a valid invoice has been submitted, has not been paid for more than 10 days after the prime has received payment.
- (D) The DEI Officer in conjunction with department directors may create subcommittees to develop additional accountability measures, benchmarks and goals.

§ 176.17 Annual Report to City Council.

The DEI Officer shall submit an annual progress report to city council. Such report shall include an analysis of city contracting; recommendations for future action; and such other information as is requested.

1701.01 DEFINITIONS.

For purposes of this Code, the following definitions shall apply:

- (a) "Public nuisance." Any lot, parcel, garage, shed, barn, house, building or structure or part thereof shall be deemed to be a public nuisance if by reason of the condition in which it is permitted to be or remain, it shall or may endanger the health, life, limb or property of any person or persons, or cause any hurt, harm, damage, injury or loss to any persons in any one (1) or more of the following ways, means or particulars:
 - (1) By reason of being dilapidated, decayed, unsafe or unsanitary, it is detrimental to health, morals, safety, public welfare and the well-being of the community, endangers life or property, or is conducive to ill health, delinquency and crime.
 - (2) By reason of being a fire hazard.
 - (3) By reason that the conditions of the public nuisance and its surrounding grounds are not reasonably or adequately maintained thereby causing deterioration and creating a blighting influence or condition on nearby properties and thereby depreciating the value, use and enjoyment of such properties to such an extent that it is harmful to the public health, welfare, morals, safety and the economic stability of the area, community or neighborhood in which such a public nuisance is located.
- (b) "Owner" means the owner or owners of record on the tax records of the County Auditor's office, ~~and shall also include~~ any purchaser or purchasers who are buying under a land contract which is recorded in either the miscellaneous records or the mortgage records of Franklin, Licking or Fairfield Counties, and any foreclosing entity as defined by Section 1399.02(L) of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Reynoldsburg.
- (c) "Director" means the Director of Public Service of the City.

- (d) "Building Official" means the Building Official, a Code Officer or other designee of the City.

1701.02 BOARD OF NUISANCE ABATEMENT.

- (a) The Board of Nuisance Abatement shall be selected from a list which includes all members of the Board of Zoning Appeals and all members of the Planning Commission. The chairman of the Board of Nuisance Abatement shall be appointed by the Mayor, without the requirement for Council approval, from this list for a term of ~~one-two~~ (21) calendar years. Upon appointment, the chairman shall then select four (4) members from the list, two (2) each from the Board of Zoning Appeals and the Planning Commission, for a term of ~~one-two~~ (21) calendar years on the Board.
- (b) It shall be necessary to have a concurring vote of at least three (3) members of the Board for a finding that a public nuisance exists as defined in Section 1701.01.

1701.03 PROCEDURE FOR FINDING A PUBLIC NUISANCE

- (a) Whenever the Director suspects the existence of a public nuisance as defined by Section 1701.01 hereof, in the City, they shall promptly cause such suspected public nuisance to be inspected by the Building Official and may request an inspection and report from the Fire District and the Board of Health. The Director shall also cause photographs to be taken of the subject property to depict the property condition. Following these inspections and the receipt of any reports by the inspecting entities within thirty (30) days of the initial request for such inspections, should the Director determine that there are reasonable grounds to believe that a public nuisance exists, they shall notify the chairman of the Board of Nuisance Abatement, who shall cause a hearing to be held by the Board of Nuisance Abatement on the question of the existence of a public nuisance. All reports of inspections, made at the request and/or direction of the Director, the inspection report of the Building Official and the photographs of the property shall be made available to the Board of Nuisance Abatement at the subject hearing.
- (b) The owner of the property in question or their duly authorized representative or agent shall be notified of the date, time and place of such hearing in accordance with the provisions of Section 1701.04 and shall be given an opportunity of appearing, in person or through a duly authorized representative or agent or legal counsel, at such hearing and of presenting evidence as may be pertinent to the question of the possible existence of the public nuisance.

- (c) The Board of Nuisance Abatement, following the hearing, shall cause a written order to be served on the owner of the subject property, in accordance with the provisions of Section 1701.04, stating the findings of such Board with respect to the existence of a public nuisance and the manner in which abatement is to be accomplished. If the Board finds that a public nuisance does exist, the order shall include: where abatement of the nuisance can be accomplished through repair or rehabilitation, a list of repair or rehabilitation specifications required to abate the public nuisance; where the abatement of the nuisance cannot, in the finding of the Board be accomplished through repair and rehabilitation, an order that the nuisance be abated by demolition and removal of the structure; and shall state that unless the owner of subject property causes the abatement of the public nuisance by repair, rehabilitation or demolition, the same shall be abated by the City at the expense of the owner. Such abatement by the owner shall start within fourteen (14) days after receipt of the order and shall be completed within sixty (60) days or where abatement is to be accomplished through repair or rehabilitation, such additional time as the Director may deem reasonable and necessary to complete the abatement of the public nuisance.

1701.04 SERVICE OF NOTICE.

The notice of hearing required under Section 1701.03 shall be served by mailing a copy to the owner, as defined in Section 1701.01 by certified U.S. mail with return receipt requested, or by personally serving such owner with a copy of such notice. If the service of the notice of the hearing provided for in Section 1701.03 is not perfected by either of the hereinbefore described methods, then the Board of Nuisance Abatement shall cause such notice to be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City and in a paper of general circulation in the county once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks prior to the date of such hearing. Service of the order of the Board provided for in Section 1701.03 shall be in the manner provided herein. If service of the order provided for in Section 1701.03 is not perfected by certified U.S. mail or personal service, as hereinbefore described then the Board shall cause such order to be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City and in a paper of general circulation in the county once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks. However, such a published order shall not include a list of the repair or rehabilitation specifications mentioned in Section 1701.03. Service of the notice or the order pursuant to this section shall be considered complete upon the receipt of certified U.S. mail or upon personal service, or seven (7) days after the date of the last publication of such notice or order.

1701.05 RIGHT TO MAKE IMMEDIATE REPAIRS.

Upon being served the order as provided for in Sections 1701.03 and 1701.04, the owner may make immediate application in writing or in person to the Building Division for a special building permit to undertake the repairs or replacement of the items, as described in the list of rehabilitation specifications found to constitute the public nuisance.

- ~~(a) The owner may make a demand in writing to the chairman of the Nuisance Abatement Board for an appeal to Council on the question of whether a public nuisance does exist within thirty (30) days after the completion of service of the order of the findings of the Board. The Board shall, within fourteen (14) days after receiving a written request for an appeal, forward all inspection reports, photographs and any other materials submitted into evidence, together with the written order issued by the Board to the Clerk of Council.~~
- ~~(b) The owner of the property in question, or their duly authorized representative or agent shall be notified of the date, time and place of the appeal hearing before Council in accordance with the provisions of Section 1701.04 and shall be given an opportunity of appearing in person or through a duly authorized representative or agent, at such hearing and of presenting such evidence as may be pertinent to the question of the existence of the public nuisance.~~
- ~~(c) The appeal shall be heard by Council within not less than fourteen (14) days nor more than sixty (60) days after the receipt of the written demand for an appeal provided for in subsection (a) hereof.~~
- ~~(d) Four (4) members of Council, after reviewing the material from the Board and any pertinent evidence presented by the owner or his duly authorized representative or agent, shall concur that a public nuisance as defined by Section 1701.01(a), does exist before enforcement of the abatement provisions of this chapter is carried out. A copy of the decision affirming, reversing or modifying the findings and order of the Board shall be served upon the owner in the manner provided for in Section 1701.04.~~

1701.067 APPEAL TO COURT.

The owner may appeal the decision and findings of ~~Council~~ the Board of Nuisance Abatement to a court of appropriate jurisdiction. ~~The decision of Council affirming, reversing or modifying the findings and order of the Board of Nuisance Abatement is to be served on the owner in the manner provided for in Section 1701.04.~~ The appeal is to be filed within fourteen (14) business days after service of the decision of ~~Council on the owner~~ the Board on the owner. After an appeal has been filed the Board of Nuisance Abatement ~~and Council~~ shall jointly certify and forward to the court as required by the Ohio Revised Code, a copy of the order of the Board of Nuisance Abatement ~~and decision of Council~~, minutes and records of meetings, hearings, inspection reports, photographs and materials relied upon by the Board of Nuisance Abatement ~~and Council~~ in determination of the afore stated order and decision.

1701.08 ABATEMENT OF A PUBLIC NUISANCE BY THE BOARD OF NUISANCE ABATEMENT.

- (a) Upon failure of the property owner to abate a nuisance, ~~the Director of Public Service is hereby authorized to cause entry upon such premises, and the owner shall permit such entry, to abate the nuisance by demolition and removal of the structure, or by boarding all windows, exterior doors and other openings to secure the structure and by removal of litter and cutting of rank growth that may be present. The failure to abate said nuisance shall occur if the owner~~

~~(1) If the owner fails to commence abatement within fourteen (14) days of the issuance of the Order and the time period for the right to appeal has expired pursuant to Section 1701.06 hereof; or~~

~~(1)(2)~~ Upon the expiration time of the special permit;

~~(2) If no special building permit was issued within forty five (45) days of completion of service of the written order of the Board of Nuisance Abatement; or~~

~~(3) Within fourteen (14) days of the expiration of the right to appeal by the owner pursuant to Section 1701.06 hereof or the Ohio Revised Code.~~

~~The Director of Public Service is hereby authorized to cause entry upon such premises, and the owner shall permit such entry, to abate the nuisance by demolition and removal of the structure, or by boarding all windows, exterior doors and other openings to secure the structure and by removal of litter and cutting of rank growth that may be present.~~

- (b) In abating such nuisances the Director shall obtain the abatement thereof as provided by the Charter and Codified Ordinances relating to construction, and the cost of such contract shall be paid for from City funds except that in the case of boarding to abate the nuisance as provided for in this section, the City may elect to do so by using its own employees and materials the costs of such abatement shall be recovered from the owner in the following manner:

(1) The owner shall be billed for the cost of the abatement by mailing such bill to the owner by certified U.S. mail with return receipt requested, or by personally serving the owner with a copy of such bill. If service of such bill is not perfected by either of the hereinbefore described methods, then the billing notice shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City and a newspaper of general circulation in the county for two (2) consecutive weeks.

- (2) If the owner fails to pay for the cost of such abatement within thirty (30) days after receipt of the bill, or after the publication of the second notice in the aforesaid newspaper, the Director shall cause the cost of the abatement to be either certified to the County Treasurer and levied as a special assessment against the property which was the subject of the abatement action, and recovered in the manner provided for the recovery of special assessments; or shall be collectible, together with any interest thereon, by suit, as other debts of like amounts are collectible.
